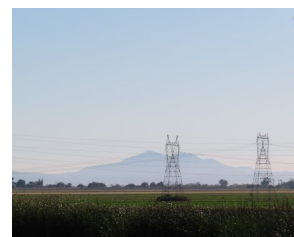
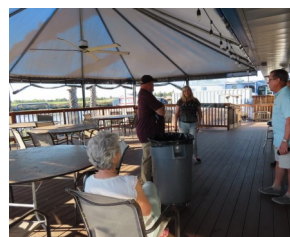

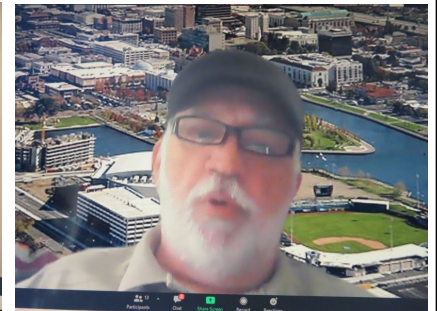

After high school Rob attended San Joaquin Delta College, San Jacinto College and Santa Barbara City College prior to transferring to UCLA where he received his BA in Political science. Rob has taught English in South Korea, run several local political campaigns, worked in land acquisition and development and worked in project management for the natural gas pipeline industry. While working in the pipeline industry, Rob developed an expertise in robotic pipeline inspection methods and published an article and several whitepapers as well as presenting them at National and International industry conferences. His current role is Program Manager III with the City of Stockton's Community Development Department. Rob manages a team within the Business Operations division and occupies a lead role in technology adoption and process improvements related to the development and permitting process.

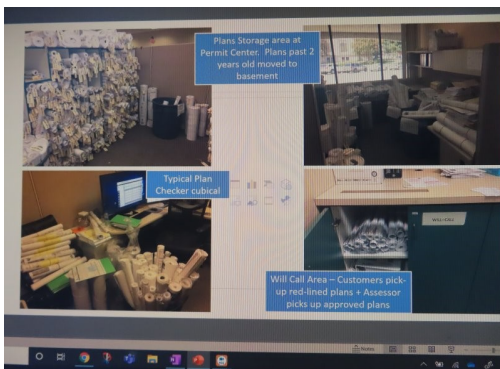




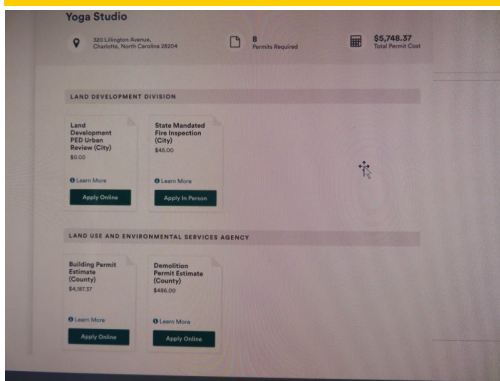
Rob lives in Stockton with his wife Lorie (ALF Class X Fellow), and their two sons Jake (11) and Grayson (6).” And now, here’s Rob!

Starting with the City, 3 1/2 years ago it seemed like he stepped back in time. Having to deal with building permits, inspection reports, new housing and new buildings, planning entitlement, the City had very little modern technology. Things have improved. Recently the Department has moved to electronic plan check. You used to have to submit 3-5 hard copy blueprints, 20 copies at \$1 a page x 50 pages. Now plans can be submitted on a thumb drive and they can be manipulate them! Saves the time it took to drive all over town delivering plans. They calculate it is a savings of \$1.2 million in printing cost, plus more on the cost of shredding and scanning.

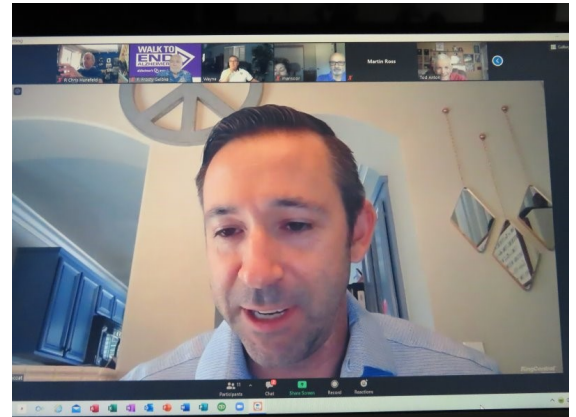
Electronic online payments are possible now. Very convenient and

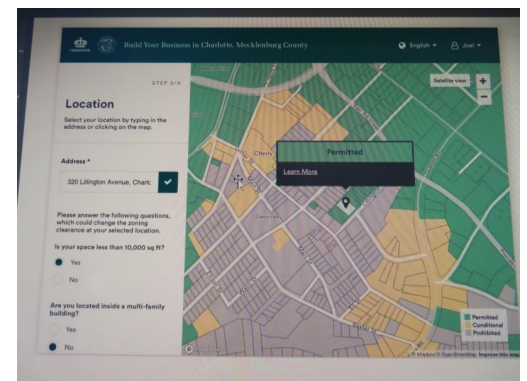
Permit discovery software for business licenses, simplifies the process.

saves more time. Rob says there was minimal resistance to the upgrades. But they had to sell these projects with solid analysis and hard numbers. Also you can now do complete online permitting Eight different kinds! So far, three out of four permits are being issued online. Rob said the goal is to make the process business friendly. The Stockton Stat—I Lab process was used to evaluate the City’s processes. It produced a list of 84 items, having to do with Building Permits, for structures and various projects and Improvement plans. That would be for streets, utilities and sidewalks, etc. These areas need to be looked into.

Using a customer first approach, 1st you would improve the building plan review process. They have a timeline and if it’s not met, it can holdup a project. They have published timelines and are hitting 60% of those. Comment letters are from each department of the review process, and the weakest or slowest reply from the review team can slow the entire process. That has been streamlined and the timelines are now being met. The improvement plan is also going through the same process. When you go to get a permit at the office, you go to a kiosk, get a number and wait. Much like the DMV. You the are called, when done you sit down again until the next dept. is ready for you. Rob is streamlining this process also. Permit discovery software will make first time businesses easier to

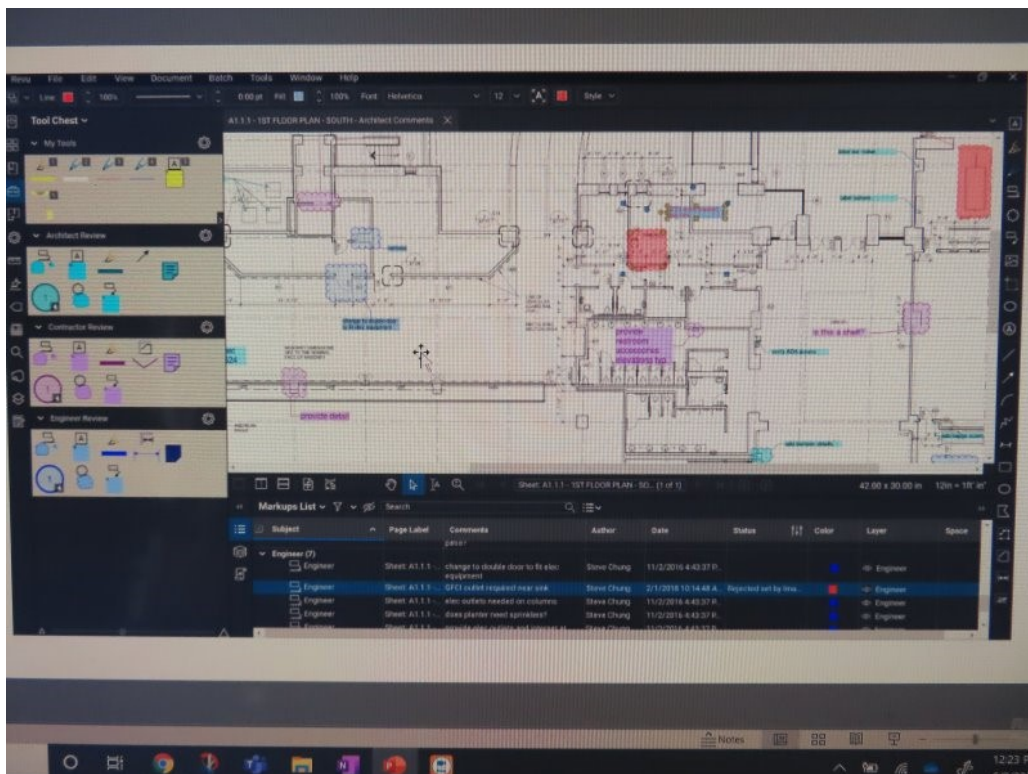
research and complete a business license application. Starting a new business can be extremely difficult to do above board, this software simplifies this.



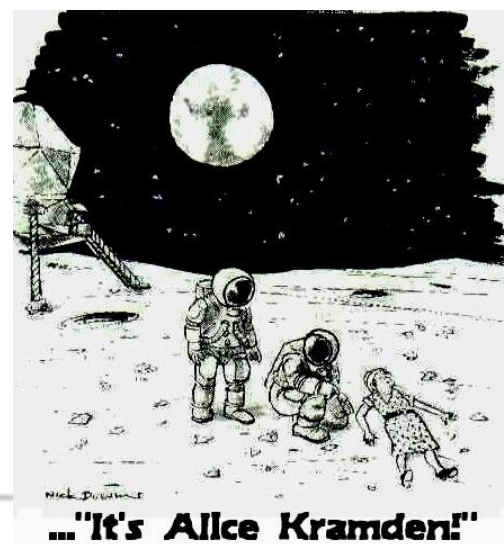
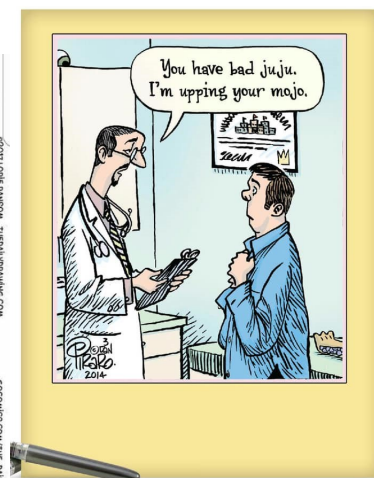
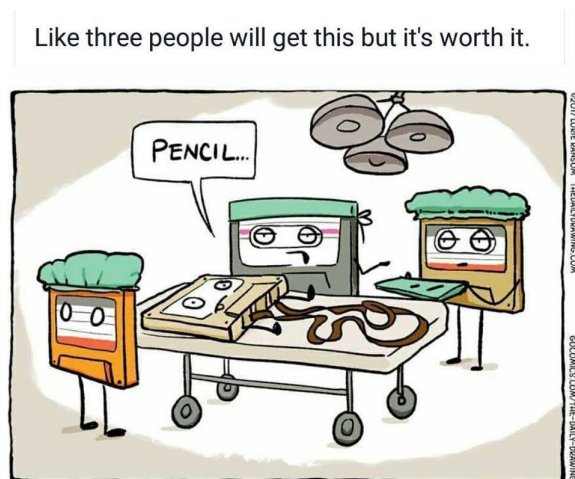
You can access the correct zoning for any address. It's like a decision tree. The result is it gives you a complete picture of cost and what's allowed for that location.

Previously unavailable stats from the City managers department will be available to the public. Tons of data, user friendly, such as how many of a certain permit were submitted last year, etc. Lots of processes are being re-viewed and improved. Another improvement will be the compatibility of software from one dept. to another. It is being looked at, for example the accounting and budgeting software has been upgraded.

So Rob has been cleaning up the City's house, getting it to run like a well oiled machine, by tackling efficiency problems. God speed Rob!
