
Mansoor and Parvin Soleimani motioned, but deferred until later.

Long time members, **Past President Mansoor and Parvin Soleimani** now had something to say to us. Mansoor started and said: My Fellow Rotarians: Every good thing in our life finally comes to an end. We have to say goodbye to you all today. Parvin and I are having very emotional and mixed feelings about departing from North Stockton Rotary. I joined the Rotary in 1981, 40 years ago. I have to tell you about the circumstances that I joined. We had to stay in the US while we received our Doctorate at UOP, Iran took the Americans hostage. We didn't have any jobs and monet to leave on. I used my sewing talent to open up a tailor shop. The hardship at the time was unbearable but we had no other choices. Some of you may still remember Dr. Mark Jantzen, UOP Dean of the School of Ed., as well as a distinguished member of this Rotary Club. One day he came into my tailor shop and told me that, "Mansoor, you should join the Rotary!"

I was familiar with the Rotary in Iran. I told him, "I can not afford to pay the membership." He said, "I will pay the first year of your membership." And he did. Now it is 40 years later I am remembering him and his generosity. Rotary accepted me with an open arm and in reality Rotary rescued me and my family from the hardship of those dark days. It has truly been an amazing journey for me. I am leaving Stockton but Stockton and Rotary are in my heart. And now Parvin:

In 1989 my husband Mansoor sponsored me to become a North Stockton Rotary member. At that time, I had a full time job, and was a proud mother to two beautiful daughters, 10 and 4 years old.

This membership came about when women in 1989 got the right to join the Rotary in the US. I was the third woman to join. The first two left soon, and I became the first woman who was also married to a Rotarian in our club. When Mansoor became President in 2017-2018, I learned about the great responsibility of the President and the board members. I have very good memories and enjoyed being Rotarians, e have made wonderful Rotarian friends. We love you and miss you. Thank you again from the bottom of our hearts. **The Soleimani's** are moving to Walnut Creek, behind gates, but close to family. We will miss you both very much. Thanks for being such good Rotarians and friends!

Speaker: Andy Chesley, speaker chair and incoming President, introduced **Claude and Jon Pellarin,** developers and co-owners of the Village West Marina & Resort. Their slogan, *It's more than just a Marina, It's a destination*. Claude said his Italian family came to Redwood City and opened a market during the depression. With no chicken meat available, they bought a chicken farm. Time passed and they came out of the depression and developed the farm into

duplexes and their developing company was born. He said he was raised on the delta and sees so much potential in our incredible waterways. He has looked for a delta destination for 20 years. When the Village West Marina came up for sale, they bought it. He moved his whole family. Including his 91 year old

mother here from Redwood City. They all now reside in Brookside. He also moved his corporate offices to Brookside, having bought two buildings in the Brookside Industrial Park.

The Village West Marina has The Garlic Brothers Restaurant, Bob's at the Marina, First Class Yacht Sales, Delta Marine Sales, Sunset Sweets, Village West Yacht Club and Freedom Boat Club as tenants.

They have renovated the Marina by adding 1 bedroom, 1 bath units with full Kitchens and an incredible view of our delta and Mt Diablo. The cost is \$150 a/night during the week and weekends nights are \$175. They've added a convenience store to the fueling dock, a deck to lounge and fish off as well as rerouting the road to allow better access, trailer/RV parking and a dog run to the Marina. The actual berths and occupancy has been updated, ridding the abandoned boats, (they were smashed in the open. You better pay your rent!), as well as floatation docks for ski boats, so they can stay all

year round. They have a new rental business. You can rent pontoon boats, Kayaks, Stand up paddleboards and hydro bikes!

They applied and got a Gold 5 anchor rating from the Global Marina Accreditation by meeting all their requirements. One of three marinas that do in California.

They also are renovating the old In shape tennis club. They're calling it the Club. The public is invited to join. They have removed 4 tennis courts, to provide 100 parking spaces.

There are 4 tennis courts, 4 pickle ball courts and a large swimming pool and veranda area. The 1st floor is a 3600 sf fitness center and the 2nd floor is a ballroom, all glass with delta views. This event center is available to the public for rental.

What an exciting and real improvement for Stockton!

Claude was asked if the courts are lighted, and they are not. The neighbors wouldn't appreciate it.

President Evan thanked The Pellarin's for the interesting presentation, rang the bell and we were out at 1:27pm.
