CDR Chad A. Bollmann, USN, PhD
Assistant Professor, Department of Electrical &
Computer Engineering
Director, NPS Center for Cyber Warfare
Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, CA

Chad Bollmann is a native of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and a 1996 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, where he received a Bachelor of Science in Ocean Engineering. He earned Master's of Science degrees in Technology & Policy and Nuclear Engineering from MIT and a Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering from the Naval Postgraduate School.

Prior to selection as a Permanent Military Professor, he qualified for command as a submarine warfare officer while serving as the executive officer on USS NEVADA (SSBN 733) (GOLD). His previous tours include reactor control assistant and chemistry and radiological controls officer aboard USS COLUMBIA (SSN 771); chief engineer on USS PENNSYLVANIA (SSBN 735) (GOLD); and Director, Fleet Command Center and Continuity of Operations Planning for Headquarters, U.S. Pacific Fleet.

As a Permanent Military Professor, CDR Bollmann instructs and conducts research in the Electrical and Computer Engineering Department at the Naval Postgraduate School. His research interests include computer network communications, network anomaly detection, industrial control system cybersecurity, and signal processing. He also serves as the Director of the Center for Cyber Warfare, a cross-functional laboratory facilitating cybersecurity education and theoretical and applied research into various technologies and systems operated or utilized by the Department of Defense. As Director, CDR Bollmann conducts research, advises student thesis work, and coordinates and supports the cybersecurity research activities of five principle investigators and two laboratory engineers.

Susan Freeland



Susan Freeland shares her life story. A Rotarian since 1987, Susan Freeland was elected the first female president of our club in 2006 – a moment of great pride in her Rotary life to this day.

Susan grew up in Oklahoma, which explains a lot of things. When she was 12, her parents Royden and Virginia Freeland bought a vintage stone barn and remodeled it into the family home – that explains the rest. Susan was thereafter known as the girl who grew up in a barn – also a distinction of great pride – no one else in

her high school class could make a similar claim.

She attended The Colorado College in Colorado Springs, graduating Phi Beta Kappa in 1967. So, what does one do with a degree in Political Science and Economics?

Well, you get a job teaching kindergarten on live television, of course! While working on her Master's degree in teaching she auditioned for an on-air TV role as "teacher" on the nationally syndicated, locally broad-



cast Romper Room show. For nearly 9 years, 5 days a week, she herded six 5-year-olds on live television – a distinction that rivals living in a barn! Every child who grew up in southern Colorado in the 1970's, knew Miss Susan!

Susan and her three children moved to Monterey in 1985 where she took a position with Hospice of the Central Coast to develop a fundraising program for the organization. She was responsible for raising the capital funds to build the in-patient Hospice facility, now known as Westland House.

In 1992, Susan decided to fulfill a lifelong desire to attend law school, graduating at the top of her class at Monterey College of Law in 1996, thus, adding yet another attorney to the Rotary club's attorney-laden roster! She accepted a position with Bank of America to manage their regional Trust and Private Banking office, and later joined First National Bank to start their Wealth Management and Trust Services office. Since 2004 she has been Broker Associate for Carmel Realty Company.

Along the way she met Ken Schley and they married, combining their families in 1988 – finally got it right! They have 4 children and 7 grandchildren ranging in age from 3 to 26, and all appropriately indulged by their grandparents – now her most cherished distinction!

Community service has been a constant in Susan's life, serving on the boards of the Monterey County Symphony, the Action Council, York School, Rotary Club of Monterey, CSUMB Planned Giving Council, NPGS Planned giving advisory Board, Chair of the Monterey History and Art Association and currently serves on the Carmel Valley Manor Board, and Chair of the Carmel Valley Manor Foundation. She also serves as a founding director of 1st Capital Bank.
