

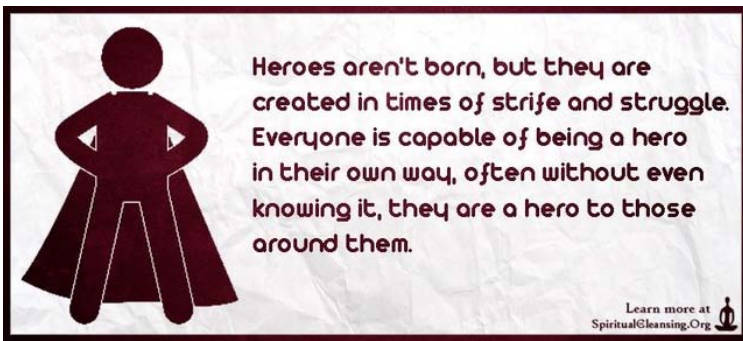

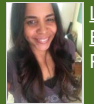

The Romanov Tercentenary egg is a jeweled Easter egg made under the supervision of the Russian jeweler Peter Carl Fabergé in 1913, for Tsar Nicholas II of Russia. The Fabergé egg was presented by Nicolas II as an Easter gift to his wife, the Tsaritsa Alexandra Fyodorovna in 1907.

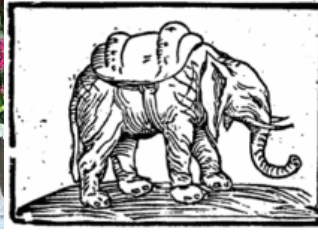
Green Valley has two meeting times:
