



William N Evans, MD ♦ Co-Director, Children ♦ s Heart Center, Nevada



Dr. Evans, a former Rotarian, obtained his MD from the University of California, Irvine. He then completed his Internship, Residency, and Pediatric Cardiology Fellowship at the Children ♦ s Hospital Los Angeles. As a long-standing member of the Las Vegas medical community, Dr. Evans has held positions at several area hospitals and served as a board member of numerous charities. He is the Founder and Past President of the Las Vegas Pediatric Society. In 1980, Dr. Evans established, and continues to serve as Co-Director of the Children ♦ s Heart Center. Dr. Evans is board certified in both Pediatrics and Pediatric Cardiology. Dr. Evans speaks Spanish.

Children ♦ s Heart Center is the only congenital cardiology practice in the state of Nevada and has grown into one of the largest such programs in the country. Comprised of thirteen pediatric cardiologists, two congenital heart surgeons and supported by a nursing department and staff of over 100, they continue their quest to make Nevada a world-wide center for the treatment of children and adults with congenital heart disease.

Children ♦ s Heart Center Nevada serves patients in five offices throughout the state as well as most Nevada hospitals. Their mission is to provide the very best medical care to children with heart disease; to communicate as best they can with the children and their families in an understanding and compassionate way and to improve services by building a team of people who will develop and maintain a quality and service-oriented attitude that will lead the medical community and satisfy patients and their referring physicians.

Children ♦ s Heart Center hosts Camp Mend-a-Heart is a cost-free, medically supervised camp for children ages 7-17 receiving medical treatment in Nevada who are born with or develop a heart condition. Camp Mend-a-Heart is the only medically supervised camp of its kind in Nevada. It was canceled this year due to the Covid-19 pandemic

Camp Mend-a-Heart offers a camping experience with sports, arts & crafts, water games and many other recreational activities and programs associated with a traditional summer camp. Camp Mend-a-Heart is staffed by volunteer counselors, nurses and physicians who give from their hearts to help these special kids.

Tips to avoid floods/ water damage

- Know how to turn off the water to your house. Test it.
- Know when you may have a leak. Turn off water, check the water heater and see if you are losing water anywhere
- Where to look? Bathroom, kitchen, laundry room, exterior
 - o Bathroom:
 - ♦️ listen to the sounds, check the sink,
 - ♦️ Large lose issues include temperature changes- stress on pipes
 - o Kitchen:
 - ♦️ Check under the sink- garbage disposable
 - ♦️ Check behind the refrigerator- pull the fridge out occasionally
 - o Laundry
 - ♦️ Replace hoses three-five years
 - ♦️ Grade lines
 - ♦️ Look for discoloration
 - o Exterior
 - ♦️ Usually not covered by insurance
 - ♦️ Considered flood water

- Prevention tips
 - o Turn off water when you're on vacation- older homes don't have that control
 - o Be sure that exterior water is running away from your house
 - o Regular get a roof inspection
 - o Check your AC
 - o Check your water heater- because of the hardness of the water, it creates challenges for pipes
- Do's and Don't's
 - o Call a professional
 - o Don't stand under where the water is flooding
 - o Remove valuables, rugs, furniture, and belongings
 - o Open doors, turn on fans
 - o Don't wait! Call a professional immediately
 - o Insurance will usually cover the professional's visit
 - o Don't use the household vacuum or appliances
 - o Don't pull or remove carpet
 - o Pros have the correct equipment and experience to avoid extensive damage
