


October 1, 2020

Dr. Brian Labus, Assistant Professor, School of Public Health, UNLV



Master's of Public Health Internship Program Coordinator

Expertise: Infectious Disease, Disease Surveillance, Outbreak Investigation, COVID-19

PP Mike Peterson introduced Dr. Labus. They have been friends since first grade. Brian Labus is an expert on communicable disease surveillance, disease epidemiology, and outbreak investigation.

Labus, a Registered Environmental Health Specialist through the National Environmental Health Association, is an assistant professor of epidemiology and biostatistics within UNLV's School of Public Health. Prior to joining UNLV, he spent 15 years as a senior investigator for the Southern Nevada Health District conducting outbreak investigations and disease surveillance, and implementing public health informatics systems.

In March 2020, Nevada Gov. Steve Sisolak selected Labus to serve on a five-member statewide task force to help advise on the scientific aspects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

His research and expertise have been featured in numerous news outlets such as KNPR, MindBodyGreen, and LiveScience. His work has also been featured in academic and professional publications including the Twenty-Eighth Annual Conference on Innovative Applications of Artificial Intelligence, Nevada Journal of Public Health, Epidemiology and Infection, Clinical Infectious Diseases, and Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report.

Dr. Labus feels things are going in a good direction with numbers better than they were earlier.. The goal is 5% and we are currently at 7%. He shared his observations and updated information of Covid-19 in Nevada. He shed light on the statistics we hear and debunked rumors and misinformation. The decrease in deaths is misleading to public. It doesn't tell much about the state of the current outbreak as it takes a long time to report. A full investigation to be completed from infection to death shows information from the month before. He explained the processes of testing and for finding a vaccination. He shared that nobody



knows when an immunization will be ready.

Thank you, Dr. Labus for joining us this morning and sharing your knowledge. President Terry presented him with a RCGV thermal mug as a token of our appreciation.

Dr. Tunji Funsho, chair of Rotary's Nigeria National PolioPlus Committee, joins 100 pioneers, artists, leaders, icons, and titans as one of Time's 100 Most Influential People. TIME announced its 2020 honorees during a 22 September television broadcast on ABC, recognizing Funsho for his instrumental leadership and work with Rotary members and partners to achieve the eradication of wild polio in the African region.

He is the first Rotary member to receive this honor for work toward eradicating polio.

A Rotarian for 35 years, Funsho is a member of the Rotary Club of Lekki, Nigeria, past governor of District 9110, and serves on Rotary's International PolioPlus Committee. Funsho is a cardiologist and a fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of London. He lives in Lagos, Nigeria with his wife Aisha. They have four children; Habeeb, Kike, Abdullahi and Fatima; and five

grandchildren.

TIME 100 comprises individuals whose leadership, talent, discoveries, and philanthropy have made a difference in the world. Past honorees include Bono, the Dalai Lama, Bill Gates, Nelson Mandela, Angela Merkel, Oprah Winfrey, and Malala Yousafzai.
