"Seasons of Life in a Japanese Garden"

INTRODUCER: FRANK FISH



"Seasons of Life in a Japanese Garden." We may think of the seasons of plants, the time they bloom, their foliage and their fall colors, but in the Japanese garden we will visit plants and garden design are used as a metaphor for our human lives. This is a most unusual treatment and approach to landscape design. This Japanese garden, found in Ireland, is also an example of exceptional attention and skill in its maintenance.

John Karlik has been a scientist

with the University of California Cooperative Extension for more than 30 years, working

in the areas of horticulture and environmental science. In the course of his work, he has conducted 10 horticulture study tours to landscapes and gardens in Europe and Asia. His research has been related to plant science, pesticide use reduction, and biogenic emissions from green plants that contribute to formation of air pollutants. His teaching activities have included numerous seminars and classes for adult audiences, and for 15 years he has been a visiting professor at Central European University in Budapest, teaching in the subject area of atmospheric science.



Bob asked to imagine a walk among different urban locales, such as a hike in the Orange historic district, Old Town Torrance, historic Boyle Heights, or the San Pedro port, or city walks with views of the Santa Monica

and San Gabriel mountains, or out to the Pacific Ocean.

Bob let us know that urban hikes are like regular hikes, except that they allow us to explore interesting urban areas on foot. He tries to develop hikes in areas where cars are not allowed.

Bob started leading his walks approximately 12 years ago.

Bob was greatly influenced during his time at Occidental College by Professor Robert Winter, who was an avid cheerleader for all things Los Angeles. Bob was also influenced by and worked with David Gebhard, an architectural historian who specialized in the architecture of California,

Bob urged us to "get out and explore your city on foot."

Unfortunately, due the sound interruption delay, **President Cory** had to ask Bob to end his presentation early, but Bob agreed to stay after the meeting to take questions.

President Cory then timely adjourned the meeting at 1:30 p.m., advising us that next week's speaker will be scientist John Karlik, who will speak on "Seasons of Life in a Japanese Garden."
