"One Person One Vote - Redistricting" Introducer: Jan Sanders



Martha Y. Zavala was selected president of the League of Women Voters-Pasadena Area in June 2020. Ms. Zavala joined the League in 2015 after years of "voting with the League".

In 2016, Ms. Zavala was selected Director of Voter Services responsible for voter education and voter engagement.

Ms. Zavala retired from Los Angeles County after 40 years of service. During her tenure, she helped manage replacement to the County's saging financial, purchasing, personnel and payroll systems. A daughter of immigrants from Mexico, Ms. Zavala was born and raised in East Los Angeles.

President Cory said that today's in person attendance was 53 and he has set a goal for 70 in person attendees by November. He had sheets on the table on which he asked people to write down which of

Then **Phyllis Currie** introduced **Eric Klinkner**, Pasadena Rotary member and Deputy General Manager, Pasadena Water and Power (PWP). He spoke on "Water and Electric Shortages: Similar Challenges, Similar Solutions."

Pasadena's water usage has been steadily dropping with a blip up in 2021. Pasadena is in a Level 2 Water Shortage, with limits on watering

The US Bureau of Reclamation has declared it first ever river cutback, with Arizona, Nevada and Mexico losing some of their share of the Colorado River. California has senior rights. Lake Mead is 35% full. Lake Oroville is 24% full. Diamond Valley Lake, a Metropolitan Water District reservoir, is 80% full.

Relating water and electricity, the hydroelectric output is reduced by 20%. The Hyatt Power Plant is shut down for the first time because there isn't enough water to run it.

Pasadena's electricity usage has dropped by 20% and the resources are getting cleaner. Many people have installed solar panels. There are no longer subsidies but the



savings on the purchase of electricity will be enough to justify the costs.

The projections for summer 2022 are concerning. There is a shortage predicted, particularly in the early evening hours. That could result in rolling blackouts.

On July 30, Governor Newsom issued an Emergency Proclamation. Solutions to the shortfall include: Accelerate new clean energy and storage projects by streamlining the process; Additional use of existing/backup generation in part by issuing air permit waivers; and incentivizing load reduction.

There was a lively question and answer before **President Cory** closed the meeting.

So - the spoon. The Presidential gavel is missing so **President Cory** had to use a spoon to open and close the meeting.


