Chief Development Officer, Los Angeles Regional Food Bank

Roger Castle is a member of the senior management team for the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank, overseeing all staff across development, marketing and communications. He has nearly 20 years experience as a professional fundraiser in the nonprofit sector. As chief development officer at the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank, he is responsible for the strategic development, implementation and oversight of all fundraising activities to support the organization.

Before joining the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank, Roger served as the vice president of development at the Prostate Cancer Foundation, the largest philanthropic organization funding prostate cancer research globally. He led all donor stewardship and fundraising activities at the nonprofit, including the successful Home Run Challenge with partner Major League Baseball. Previously, Roger worked at the John Wayne Cancer Institute and Saint John's Health Center Foundation, and the Muscular Dystrophy Association.

Roger graduated summa cum laude from the University of Tennessee at Martin with a bachelor's degree in education, and was a four-year member of the men's basketball team. He earned a master's degree, thereafter, from University of Tennessee, Knoxville. Roger lives in Venice, California and enjoys sports, live music, and his two dogs.

George Falardeau introduced our speaker, Erik Laykin, whose topic was The Future of Personal Transportation: The Autonomous Vehicle.




Speaker Erik Laykin

Erik predicts a future in which all cars are autonomous. People would no longer own a private car but would pay a fare to the fleet of autonomous vehicles. Parking lots would disappear in urban areas because the cars would with be in motion or parked in


less densely populated area. People could do work or other activities in the car. You could even hold a zoom call with a glass of wine (delivered robotically in the vehicle.) McKinsey predicts that AVs will reduce traffic accidents by 90%.

There will be 192 million cars connected to the Internet by next year. A fully autonomous car will use 4000 GB per day. German expects that AVs will hold 42% of the market by 2035.



There are downsides to the societal shift, not least of which are hackers and increased personal surveillance.

The cars themselves are becoming more advanced as we evolve toward that future. They currently use LIDAR, Light Detection and Ranging, to see 360 degrees around the car and respond accordingly. This too raises concerns. So far the cars have been fooled by phantom images. A person could insert a visual of a stop sign and the car would respond, leaving the car open to someone flashes a stop sign image at a point when a car would stop too quickly and cause cars behind it to crash.



There is also the ethical issue. If there is a troop of Girls Scouts crossing the street and the car doesn't have time to stop, does the car drive off a cliff, killing the passenger. As **Marshall Fuss** noted on the chat, it's the old trolley dilemma.

After the breakout sessions, **President Ken** ended the meeting, exhorting us to always follow the 4 way test. Erik stuck around for questions moderated by **Kat Rogers.**
