



Among other efforts, a new 24/7 emergency shelter should start bringing significant assistance to the homeless community around March 2018. In addition, Pomona's many geographic benefits should provide a vast array of untapped economic opportunities to help alleviate the city's financial concerns. The "Starfish Project", named after the shape of the 10-57-71 freeway intersection, is looking to find ways to realize Pomona's potential as a regional economic and cultural hotspot.
