

# **PROGRAM - Grace Sanchez - The Grace Group**

Since Van Muse from Pathways College couldn't make the meeting, Grace Sanchez instead told us a bit about the Grace Group and her current involvements. The Grace Group is an organization that provides fundraising and grant writing services. They were able to raise around \$4.6 million in 2017 for institutions like the Pomona Valley Health Centers, Western U., and the Hearst Foundation.

Grace Sanchez is also involved in mentoring and was preparing for a meeting with a young lady who wanted to make some fundamental changes in her life. To coach her through the process, Grace came up with the metaphor of a chick breaking out of its egg. For this to succeed, the chick needs to PECK its way through the shell. In Grace's metaphor, the "P" in "peck" stands for your current position in your community. She believes that everyone is in their respective positions for a reason and will be able, with close inspection, to find ways to leverage this position to achieve their goals. "E" stands for one's exposure, i.e. one's background, roots, and heritage. Rather than trying to forget or hide or leave behind this background, one should embrace it and derive strength and an understanding of one's unique advantages from it. "C" stands for the courage that one needs to have to confidently take steps towards one's goal. Finally, "K" stands for the deep knowledge that one needs to develop about one's surrounding people, business environment, or general situation. This knowledge takes time to build, but is essential to the success of any endeavor.
