

The Professional Golfers' Association of America (PGA of America) was founded in 1916 to grow, teach. and manage the game of golf. It has since grown to be the world's largest sports organization with a total of 29,000 members. It is organized into 14 districts and 41 sections. The PGA also has a youth section, called the Junior Tour, that is focused on children and teenagers from the age of 7 to 18 and has about 2,600 members nationwide.

One of the largest of the PGA's sections is the Southern California (SCPGA) section in District 11. It covers the area of California that extends from the

> Mexican border all the way to the northern end of San Bernardino

County. It is comprised of 1,700 members working at over 500 facilities within the section. The SCPGA Junior Tour is looking to provide opportunities to the youth to experience the

It does so by supporting local groups and facilities and by hosting around 275


junior tournaments annually. To make these tournaments as accessible as possible, the SCPGA provides grants totaling around \$25,000-30,000 every year to allow children that can't afford the entrance and membership fees to participate by covering these

The SCPGA also gives out college scholarships that range from \$500 to \$3,000 per scholarship. To make the game even more broadly accessible, the SCPGA's ClubsForeYouth program donates golf clubs to schools and youth in need and distributed around 250 sets to 40 high schools in 2017.

To be able to expand these efforts, the SCPGA is always looking for donations, partners, and ambassadors. A whole range of other job and volunteering opportunities at the SCPGA exists as well.
