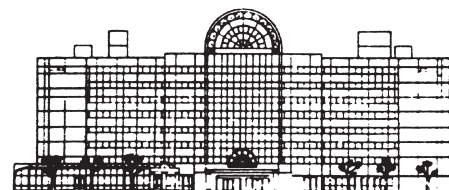

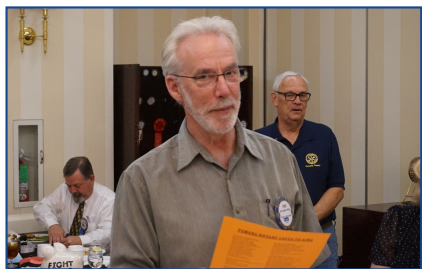

Pomona to nominate 40 participants for their Compassionate Leadership Program free of charge. This program is a compassion-focused leadership training course that extends over 3 months starting with a meeting on March 20th from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.. Mayor Tim Sandoval will be speaking on the program at the City Council meeting on March 19th.

PROGRAM - 4-Way Test Speech Contest

This year, we had 7 students from 4 Pomona high schools compete in the 4-Way Test Speech Contest. In this contest, students are asked to prepare and deliver a 6 to 8 minute speech on a topic related to this year's Rotary theme "Making a Difference". The speech must subject the topic and any recommended actions to the Rotary 4-Way Test. In our club's contest, the winner will receive \$250, the first runner-up \$150, and the second runner-up \$100. The winners of each club's contests will then compete at higher and higher levels until a District winner is chosen.

Bernard Wong from iPoly High School won first place with his speech on homelessness in Pomona and across the country. He used the example of the hardships faced by a single mother and her daughter and his own volunteer activities to show how helping the homeless easily passes the 4-Way Test.

Genesis Rodriguez from Village Academy spoke on the value of community, collaboration, and

volunteering and how these pass the 4-Way Test.

Melissa Molina from Village Academy won second place with her speech on the value of hope and perseverance as a very effective, 4-Way Test compatible way to overcome challenges.

Vicente Ibarra from Garey High School spoke on the value of accessible education as the foundation of truth and societal progress that passes the 4-Way Test.

Isabel Alvarez from Garey High School proposed mandatory mental health education in high schools as a 4-Way Test compatible way to help alleviate the problems caused by this under-recognized disease.

Heiny Gomez from Garey High School also spoke on the value of helping the homeless and how such efforts would help a community to pass the 4-Way Test.

Abigail Acosta from Freemont Academy won third place with her speech on how a fundamental focus on accepting others regardless of their background, race, sexual orientation or other differences leads to behavior that passes the 4-Way Test.
