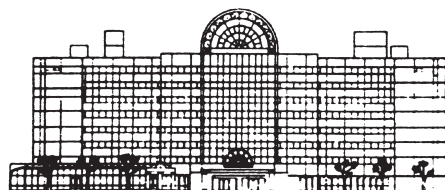

## AROUND THE CLUB

As part of the Rotary Group Cultural Exchange between Districts 3261 and 5300, we were visited by a delegation from India today. The delegation consisted of 5 members: Team leader **Ajay Agrawal** from

Rourkela, a partner in a retail petroleum and ayurvedic products company; **Montek Singh Hura** from Sambalpur, a director in his family's retail and hospitality company; **Neha Ramani** from Raipur, who works for the public works department of the state of Chhattisgarh; **Anmol Shrivastava** from Raipur, a visual and graphics designer; and **Awleen Chawla** from Raipur, a director in her family's agricultural chemicals company.

The Rotary clubs of District 3261 are involved in several regional high-profile projects like covering almost one-third of the cost of a new cardiac catheterization lab at Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Hospital which provides free treatment to children and infants with cardiac problems.

Together with two other districts, the club in 2015 also put on the Rahat Medical Mission in Jagdalpur, which provided free treatment for a variety of conditions. The mission's 25 doctors, 200 nurses, and 359 volunteers registered over 25,000 patients and performed around 1,500 surgeries over 13 days.

## PROGRAM - M. Pacheco - Forgotten Hollywood

Manny Pacheco is the author/director of the Forgotten Hollywood series, which includes books, a blog, a podcast, and a documentary that is currently being produced. In this series, Manny Pacheco ties Hollywood into the broader history of America and Rotary by remembering stories about lesser known actors and illustrating how their lives touched or were touched by important historic events.

One of these actors is Van Heflin, who appeared in over 150 movies, including "Shane", "The Strange Love of Martha Ivers", and "Airport". He performed in the movie "Cry of Battle", which was expected to be a huge box office success and shown at almost all

theatres across the country, but ended up performing very poorly.

But, it was this movie that was playing when Lee Harvey Oswald fled into the Texas Theatre after shooting police officer J. D. Tippit and was arrested there.

Manny Pacheco also remembers the actor Lionel Barrymore, who was one of only two actors to ever be awarded lifetime contracts at MGM. In the 1930s, Barrymore broke his hip and was then diagnosed with advanced degenerative arthritis, which confined him to a wheelchair for the rest of his life. During this time, one of the main appeals of movies to the public was as a means to escape reality and live in the perfect world of Hollywood for a while. Thus, disability and disease were usually kept out. But due to his lifetime contract, Barrymore was able to insist on roles that allowed him to appear in his wheelchair. This sudden acceptance of disability prompted Helen Keller to speak to Eleanor Roosevelt about her husband's infantile paralysis and the idea of partnering with Hollywood to raise money to fight disease. From that discussion, the March of Dimes was formed, which became one of the most successful fundraising campaigns ever and conquered polio in the United States.

The success of this campaign continued when Rotary launched its campaign to eradicate polio in the rest of the world as well.
