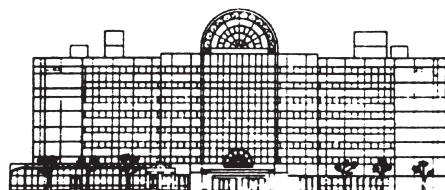

PROGRAM - David Speidel - RYLA

RYLA (the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards) is an annual two-and-a-half-day leadership training program for high school juniors in the District chosen for their leadership potential. RYLA seeks to develop leadership skills with an emphasis on the fundamentals and ethics of positive leadership, the importance of communication skills, leadership in problem solving and brainstorming, group dynamics, and building self-confidence and self-esteem. This year's event was the biggest to date in our District with over 500 people in total. This included 373 attending students, whose cost for the event was fully sponsored either by one of the Rotary clubs of the District or by other local organizations or individuals. 13 of these students came from Pomona, 8 of whom were sponsored by our club, 4 by PUSD and 1 by Pomona Catholic. 38 students who attended last year helped mentor this year's students as senior advisors. 3 of these came from Pomona. 16 Rotarians (2 from our club) acted as facilitators to lead students in the various activities. Finally, there were several invited speakers and a large number of support staff. The students were split up into 6 groups, which were each assigned one continent. Within the continents, the students were further divided into 6 subgroups that each were assigned a city in their respective continent, leading to around 10 students per subgroup. These "cities" formed the working teams for the different

activities. One of the biggest activities was the RYLA Challenge, a competition where each "city" was supposed to pick either hunger, education, or clean water as their challenge problem and develop an actionable solution to address the issue. The group then created a video using their cell phones to present the problem and advocate their solution. The different "continents" then chose a winner among their "cities". These six winning videos were shown to all attending students and a final winner was chosen. Thanks to a generous donation of \$250 by Mike Driebe and \$500 from members of the medical team, the winning team was awarded a prize of \$750. Other activities included a culture walk, a trust fall, multiple plenaries with invited speakers, evening entertainment, and an activity where all attendees helped to pack over 20,000 lunch packets to feed the homeless in San Bernardino. Three of the attendees, Faith Bechtel, Claire Guillen, and Hailey Hopkins talked briefly about what they took away from RYLA and mentioned learning to trust others, learning that even as a quiet person, one can be a leader, learning about personality types and how to put yourself into someone else's shoes to understand them, and how much a team of dedicated individuals can achieve in even a very short amount of time.
