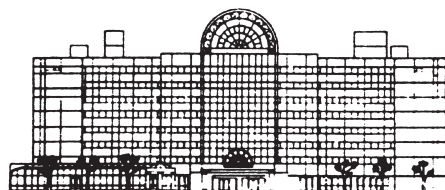

PROGRAM - Miguel Santana - Fairplex

To be ready for its centennial in 2022, Fairplex decided to reflect on its strategic plan by holding 9 work sessions with over 500 participants that generated around 700 ideas leading to 57 initiatives. Since Fairplex hadn't changed their articles of incorporation since 1922, this was one of the first documents to be reevaluated, but it was found that, despite its age, no changes were needed. Fairplex did revise its mission and vision statements, though, to emphasize being a place and convenor for the best and brightest people of Southern California, being a place that creates lasting memories, and being an institution that strengthens its community.

The new guiding principles are the public benefit, the guest experience, partnerships, sustainability, and showcasing the uniqueness of Southern California.

The new strategic plan is focussed on 3 main drivers:

1. Fairplex as an economic engine:

An economic review estimated the total economic output generated by Fairplex to be around \$58.2 million in Pomona and \$499.6 million in Southern California annually. Fairplex is planning to further increase this economic impact by developing more

space to be ready by the time the Metro Gold Line extension is completed. This space will include facilities for housing, office, retail, sports, performing arts, and healthy living.

2. Fairplex as a community partner:

Fairplex is planning to significantly increase its offerings in many areas, including the arts, agriculture, entertainment, and recreation. These efforts will include an expansion of the CDC and the Millard Sheets arts center, K-8 summer camps, a teaching kitchen, a farm store, more science and technology events, as well as a year-round hands-on kids museum.

3. Fairplex Presents:

Fairplex is aiming to become a model destination for arts, culture, and entertainment by paying close attention to safety, its facilities, crowd control and parking, service, and responsiveness to guest inquiries. Fairplex is planning to become a premier food and music destination and hold even more competitions and marquee events.

One of its main events, the LA Country Fair, will be a truly unique experience this year with its Route 66 Theme. Special admission deals for county and city residents will be available, as well as Route 66 inspired food discounts. The Fair will even bring back a temporary, themed clock tower.
