PROGRAM

Jason Heath - Casa Colina Musical Playground

Physical therapy can often be a challenging endeavor with young children or patients with autism.

To help with motivation and to facilitate the mental and emotional connections needed for successful therapy, Casa Colina has decided to partner with RotoLab to design an outdoor interactive musical playground.

This playground will consist of several structures that are equipped with a variety of touch and motion sensors. These structures include two short flights of stairs leading to the top of a small hill with a water-feature. The steps as well as the hand-rails can sense touch, including the position of the patient's foot on the step.

The touch and motion inputs can be used by a software system to trigger a variety of complex audio-visual feedback signals for the patient, including music, sound-effects, light, etc.

Since the auditory system of the brain is strongly linked to many other important regions, like the motor and emotional centers, well-designed feedback can be used to significantly enhance a patient's experience and therapy outcomes. Music, for example, can be used to build an emotional connection with autism patients, and entertaining sound-effects can be used as a motivating reward for small children for participating in the therapy.

RotoLab has specifically designed the system not only to be robust and weather-proof, but also as flexible as possible. The hardware sensors are kept very general, with complex responses generated entirely in software. This allows RotoLab to quickly iterate different ideas for therapy enhancements with the feedback of therapy specialists on site. New ideas can quickly be tested and refined for maximum effectiveness.

The system even allows for the combination of various inputs to, for example, require potentially complex collaboration of several patients to achieve a certain reward. This can be used, for instance, to teach collaboration and team work to children with autism. This musical playground at Casa Colina is one of the first of its kind in the country and the true power and potential of this new therapy enhancing device is just starting to be discovered. If the system proves itself, it will likely be deployable at other facilities around the country.
