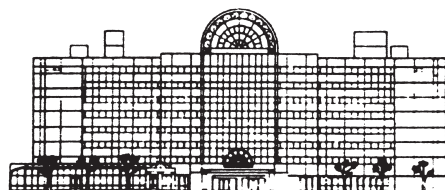

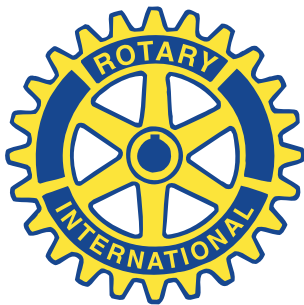

## PROGRAM - Liz Goldhammer - Boys Republic

Boys Republic was founded in 1907 as a school and treatment facility for troubled youngsters. Since then, more than 31,000 disadvantaged teens, often from homes where they were abused, neglected, or abandoned, who had become juvenile delinquents, have been able to serve part or all of their probation at Boys Republic. They go through a rigorous, usually six-month training program that allows them to continue high school or earn their diploma, train for a variety of jobs, and learn how to manage their own lives to become productive parts of society. Boys Republic offers educational services including a four-year high school, substance abuse services, recreational services including a gym and baseball- and cross-country-teams, day treatment centers for children who still live at home, an independent living program for older teens, transitional apartments for program graduates who have not found another place to live, and family services offering behavioral training and family counseling. Youngsters can explore and train for a variety of future careers including masonry, culinary arts, baking, landscaping, agriculture, digital printing, warehouse

distribution, welding, woodworking, automotive services, and more. During their training they learn core skills for success in the workplace: being on time, following instructions reliably, taking care of tools and work sites, and cooperating with coworkers. Boys Republic has chosen work ethic ("nothing without labor") and self governance and responsibility as the twin ideals orienting their programs. Students are expected to earn and pay rent for their accommodations – money that they will get back upon graduation – and are trusted to shape their own lives and even the Boys Republic program. One great way to support Boys Republic is by buying wreaths from their Della Robbia program. Every year, students take charge of the planning, logistics, manufacture, packaging, marketing, and sales of spectacular decorative wreaths. These wreaths not only make wonderful gifts, but also support the Boys Republic in a very meaningful way by providing income to offset many of the unreimbursed expenses incurred by the program. Boys Republic is also fundraising for a new culinary arts kitchen and teaching bakery. Currently, students are learning by cooking on camping stoves, which do not adequately prepare them for the real amenities they will encounter in the workplace.
