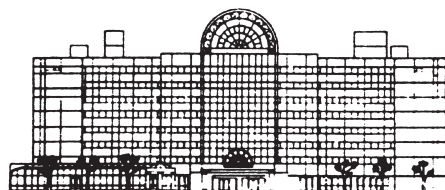

PROGRAM - Miguel Hurtado - PUSD ACE

Often, the education system in the United States is focused exclusively on trying to motivate and prepare students for a continuation of their education in a college or university. This frequently leaves students for whom a vocational school would be a better fit without the needed resources and assistance to pursue such a path.

The Pomona Unified School District offers such vocational education in their Adult & Career Education (ACE) program. Courses include academic

programs, like adult basic education, General Education Development (GED), English as a Second Language (ESL), and high school diplomas, as well as career technical education for jobs like cosmetologist, medical assistant, barber, machinist, apparel designer, construction, and office worker. ACE also teaches workforce readiness skills like resume and cover letter writing, interview preparation, computer and internet training, and relevant soft skills. Unfortunately, the college-focus of the education system has created an unintentional disconnect between PUSD's K-12 education and ACE, which ACE is actively trying to counteract. Because of this, there is room left in the program for quite a bit more than the currently enrolled 1,500 students despite the program's excellent employment placement record and financial support opportunities. Still, ACE is currently also experiencing a shortage of staff and is looking for more people interested in a career in vocational education. Looking at the success of vocational training programs in other countries where such training plays a much larger role in the overall education strategy of the country makes it clear that there is quite some room for growth of this model here in the United States.
