PROGRAM - Donyielle Holley - Hope for Home

One of Pomona's major challenges is its large number of homeless residents. To address this challenge, the City of Pomona has developed a Strategic Plan on Homelessness. This plan defines four overarching goals: To reduce the number of Pomona's unsheltered homeless, to reduce the negative impacts of homelessness on community neighborhoods and public spaces, to foster an engaged and informed community regarding homelessness and homelessness solutions, and to balance the needs and rights of homeless persons with those of the larger community. These goals are supported by several very specific strategies developed with insights from the Lived Experience Summit, during which the homeless were asked to provide feedback on their most pressing issues. These strategies now provide actionable

guidance to Pomona's program Hope for Home. Hope for Home is currently constructing a year-round homeless shelter on Mission Boulevard that is expecting its first residents

to move in before the end of the month.

Hope for Home also will be providing many different services that extend beyond providing shelter, including outreach to inform the homeless community of its available services and to create awareness in the larger community of the need for and opportunities to help. Hope for Home assists the homeless with attaining documents and applying for benefits, seeking employment, finding permanent housing, and more. Hope for Home also provides medical services including basic primary care, behavioral health care, and substance abuse disorder care.

Since homelessness is such a challenging problem of local and regional importance and origin, it cannot be addressed by a single organization or administration. Broad coalitions including the neighboring cities of La Verne and Claremont, as well as many local and regional organizations, companies, and individuals have already been formed, but more volunteers and involvement are always needed.
