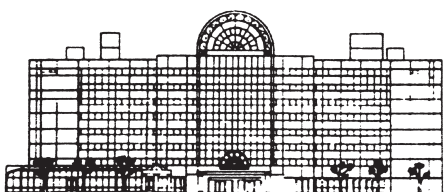

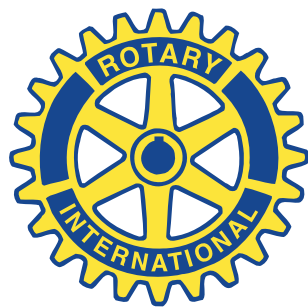

PROGRAM - Chris Nance - Cal. Earthquake Auth.

Every year, Californians practice how to drop, cover, and hold on during an earthquake in the annual Great California ShakeOut. Despite this, people still seem able to simply put earthquakes out of their mind rather than preparing for them. This shows, for example, in that only 10% of homes are covered with earthquake insurance even though most Californians live within 30 miles of an active fault line, many much closer. To help mitigate this fact, a law was passed in 1984 to require home insurance providers to offer earthquake insurance policies. But the damage caused by the

Northridge earthquake in 1994 was so high that many insurers said afterwards that they will stop offering home insurance entirely if this requirement persists. This led to the creation of the California Earthquake Authority (CEA) as a not-for-profit agency that backs earthquake insurance policies offered by home insurers. Due to its size, the CEA currently has a claim-paying ability in excess of \$16.5 billion, which should be sufficient to cover the largest earthquake event that has at least a 1% chance of occurring in the next 400 years. Its size and a wide variety of claim options allows the CEA to offer a policy that fits almost any wallet. Scientists estimate the risk of a Northridge-size (M6.7) or larger earthquake to be in excess of 99% over the next 30 years. Since regular home insurance does not cover shake damage and since the cost to rebuild very often far exceeds the assessed value of a home, homeowners should talk to their insurance agents to evaluate their risk and to sensibly plan for this event. Especially since government bailouts are very rare, and even if they do happen aren't nearly high enough to even begin rebuilding. In addition, homeowners should look into retrofitting their homes to protect them in the event of a quake.
