Mini- Grant Information: Mini-Grants 2018-2019 We have \$40,000 to give to the schools this year in Round 1 we granted 31 of the 37 applicants for a total of \$25,540. Giving St. Felicitas 14 awards, 6 to Southwestern, 2 to Clairbourne, 3 to Carver, 6 to Valentine, 2 to HMS, 4 to SMHS. We proposed to have a Round two so we can exhaust the funds set aside for mini-grants, we have evaluated all 18 applications and are awaiting acceptance of the executive committee from the Charities board to grant the 18 applicants for the total of \$14,272. One of the schools had asked for a drum set. To bring us within budget, our Rotarian Grace Yang is donating her son st drum set so we can stay in our budget. Thank you to Grace.
