Jim Folsom might suggest you take a look at the Amorphophallus titanium **t**that **t** if it hasn **t** wilted due to the heat. The Huntington website describes the Corpse Flower as follows: The world largest flower, with a bloom that can grow to more than eight feet in height and four feet in diameter. It is a rare tropical plant native to the equatorial rainforests of Sumatra, Indonesia. When in flower, it exudes a foul stench that smells like rotting meat. For that reason, Indonesians call it Bunga Bangkai, which means **©Corpse Flower.** The plant grows from a large **corm**, a bulb-like tuber, under the soil. The visible parts are the **spadix** (the fleshy upright column) and the **spathe** (the petal-like outer covering). When the plant blooms, the spathe opens to reveal a velvety maroon interior and begins to emit a foul stench. At the peak of its growth, the Corpse Flower can grow up to six inches a day!
