Mitch spoke from his heart and expressed his sadness about his mother passing away very recently. He noted that his mother was proud of him and especially so when he was named Paul Harris Fellow.

Mitch's talk covered several topics but revolved around the 1936 Olympics in Germany, Oak Trees, Jesse Owens and Cornelius Johnson, and Mitch's good relationship with his stepfather Mr. Ed McVeigh.

Mitch, who grew up in Ohio lost his father when Mitch was only five. Sometime after his father passing away, Mitch's stepfather Ed McVeigh came into the picture. It seems like Ed, who Mitch later learned was a 16 time state champion in Track and Field (running, had a significant impact on Mitch. Ed taught Mitch running techniques, and young Mitch discovered that his stepfather had raced and beaten Jesse Owen in preprimary races in High School. Mitch showed a portion of a documentary from the 1936 Olympics, highlighting Owens and Johnson's achievements, and awards. Mitch noted that each Gold Medal Winner stood on the platform, had their country flag raised, and was presented with a laurel wreath and an Oak Tree. The Oak Tree's were taken home by the winners and several were planted. Today many of them still exist. Cornelius Johnson planted his Oak Tree in Korea Town, where it still stands today. Mitch would like to see more of the Oak Tree's that were originally given to the Olympic Gold Medalists. 143 Oak Trees were awarded, and only 19 of them have been located. Perhaps we will see some of these important Oak Trees at the Huntington Library and Gardens one day.

Cambodia update- JP Mainguy's son Pierre updated our club. The aquaponics program that San Marino Rotary is helping sponsor in Cambodia seems good investment. Filtration systems have allowed for growth of plans and fish life. Fish tanks that were only 713 gallon now have capacity for 5, 283 gallons, permitting villages to stock and sell more seafood products. This is really impacting communities and helping better people's lives.

Jim Lawson will be introduced to our club by Mr. Bill Payne on September 5th, 2019. Mr. Lawson will talk about the Ronald Reagan Library and his vast experience as a docent.

Upon retirement from the technology business Jim became a docent at the Reagan Library in 2008 and is now the Docent museum coordinator.

He hails from Baltimore and graduated from University of Delaware in 1959 with a BChE degree (similar to member Bill Payne, but in 1960).

Jim served in the U S Army Chemical Corp, teaching basic training in chemical, biological, and nuclear warfare, promoted from 2nd then to 1st lieutenant.

He was next hired by BTL /Western Electric, making silicon wafers, and then spent the next 4 years at Sperry Rand Corp, before being transferred to Univac in Minneapolis, working to manufacture computer hybrid circuits. Jim transferred to Sperry Flight Systems to be engineering manager making circuits with the Space Shuttle and Orbit division.

Next, he became engineering vice president at ITT making hybrid circuits for the telecom industry in Florida, and when that plant shut down, transferred to ITT Gilifillan in Los Angeles engineering radar systems for the Navy. Jim

became the engineering vice president of San Fernando Electric, and after they closed their doors, was hired by Teledyne Microelectronics, Raytheon, National Semi CTS Microelectronics, Scrantom Engineering , and CMAC, all doing sales in the western US. His last assignment was finally as a sales representative for Microelectronics from 2003 to 2017.

In retirement, Jim spends a lot of time at the gym and has run over 107 full and half marathons! He is married and has lived in Thousand Oaks since 1981, and enjoys his gardens, pool, and genealogy.
