**If you were feeling a little like Elvis, All Shook Up on the morning of July 4<sup>th</sup>**, it is not because you were NOT falling in love. It was the ground rumbling that you felt. People of Ridgecrest felt the worst of the 6.4 quake. The quake struck at 10:33 a.m. and reports say it was 11 miles east-northeast of Ridgecrest. **What to do during an Earthquake?** The Survival Guide says: If indoors, stay there. Get under a desk or table or stand in a corner. Stay away from windows, bookcases, file cabinets, heavy mirrors, hanging plants and other heavy objects that could fall. Watch out for falling plaster and ceiling tiles. Stay under cover until the shaking stops. Hold on to your cover if it moves, move with it. If outdoors, get into an open area away from trees, buildings, walls, and power lines. If driving, pull over to the side of the road and stop. Avoid areas around power lines. Stay in your car until the shaking is over. If in a crowded public place, do not rush for the doors. Crouch and cover your head and neck with your hands and arms

**What to do after an Earthquake?** The Survival Guide says: Do not attempt to use the telephone unless there is an immediate, life-threatening emergency. If it is safe, check for gas and water leaks, and broken electrical wiring or sewage lines. If there is damage, turn the utility off at the source and immediately report gas leaks to your utility company. Stay away from downed power lines and warn others to stay away. Do not attempt to re-light the gas pilot unless your gas line has been thoroughly inspected. Call the
