Our program speaker John Howell, who works with private non-profit, Arroyos and Foothills Conservancy, shared insight about the Hahamongna to Tujunga Wildlife. John spoke passionately about the need to create a corridor to the San Gabriel's. The Hahamongna to Tujunga Wildlife Corridor Initiative has a goal of linking the San Gabriel Mountains at Hahamongna Watershed Park to the San Gabriel's at Big Tujunga Wash for wildlife passage through the San Rafael Hills and the Verdugo Mountains, a 20-mile long Corridor. John also showed images of animals and explained how tracking their movements tell where they have been and how they have endangered their lives when crossing roads and highways.
