The Bill Steele award winners gave brief acceptance speeches but were far too modest in their remarks. Thank you, gentlemen, for making a difference and for your service above self.

We had two Craft Talkers at our lunch meeting. Dan Maljanian, father of three, and husband to Patrice, spoke candidly about his way of thinking. � I am an out of the box type of thinker, said Dan, when he talked about meeting Patrice and then proposing to her in what can only be called a romantic albeit unconventional manner.
