March 7th program-Crime Scene Investigation Speaker- Dr. Ron Vogel. Dr. Ron Vogel has served as a faculty member and administrator for more than 39 years. He started his academic career as a part-time lecturer in 1975 and became a tenuretrack faculty member in 1979 after earning his doctorate from University of Massachusetts, Amherst. He went through the academic ranks at the University of North Carolina, Charlotte in the Department of Criminal Justice (1980-1991) primarily teaching research and served as a department chair (1988-91). In 1991, he moved to California State University, Long Beach (CSULB) and continued his career as a professor and chair of the Department of Criminal Justice for another 10 years before moving into administration. After interim positions as an associate dean and associate vice president for research and graduate programs, Ron became the Dean of the College of Health and Human Services at CSULB from 2002-2008. He has published dozens of peer-reviewed research articles, worked on several editorial boards and served as the editor of the tier 1 research journal Crime and Delinquency. In 2009, he became provost at California State University, Dominguez Hills before taking the position as associate vice chancellor for the CSU system in 2011. In 2015, he returned to campus life and is currently the Dean of the Rongxiang Xu College of Health and Human Services at Cal State LA.

Ho and Isaac Hung attended the Peach Conference at LaVerne University this past week. Isaac said that going into the conference he really had no idea what to expect. He was happy to report that plenary sessions (breakout sessions), and panel discussions focused on helping people understand how to get along. The focus, in large part, was built upon three basic fundamentals: practicing LISTENING, giving RESPECT, & showing COMPASSION. Armed with this approach people can learn to come to agreements that can make the workplace, our city, nation, and world more peaceful.

our Club s 2nd Global Grant Scholar, Gaelen Stanford-Moore received her Master s Degree from Cambridge University (UK) in Public Health. **Tye Jackson**, who was the program speaker on February 28th promoted the concept of teaching students, what he called professional fundamentals. He explained that students need to learn both soft and hard skills, which will be a focus at Cal State L.A. Jackson talked about a gap in education; employers are not getting well-prepared employees (college grads are not ready for jobs). Students are graduating from college without the requisite skills needed to go into the workforce and hold on to a career.

A visitor at Rotary this week, asked about the San Marino Motor Classic. Here is the history: The San Marino Motor Classic was established in 2011 by cofounders Aaron Weiss, Ben Reiling and Paul Colony held in Lacy Park, an exclusive 30-acre park in San Marino. It is the successor of the Los Angeles Concours de Elegance. In its inaugural year, the exhibition was a hybrid of a Classic Car Club of America Grand Classic and a contemporary Concours de Elegance. More than 220 Brass Era, Depression Era, and Post-War luxury and sports cars were showcased attracting more than 3,000 spectators. The 2011 event raised more than \$120,000 for its beneficiary charities, the Pasadena Humane Society & SPCA and the Rotary Club of San Marino.
