Come listen to the speaker on November 7<sup>th</sup>. Mrs. MARILYN LONG will share a compelling story about her uncle, John Karli and the Pearl Harbor attacks. After the sinking of the USS Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor on that day that shall live in infamy, December 7, 1941, San Marino resident John Karli was killed, and his body interned as an unknown in the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific, in the Punchbowl in Hawaii.

But through the efforts of the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency and the Armed Forces Medical Examiner System, John's remains were identified by DNA testing. In February 2012, two family members submitted DNA samples to a reference database. And on May 1, 2019, fulfilling a lifelong wish that their relative would return home, Seaman First Class John Karli's remains were transferred to the mainland, and laid to rest with his parents, given a full Military Honors Ceremony at Mountain View Cemetery in Altadena.

His niece Marilyn Long will tell of his San Marino roots, his recruitment on his 18th birthday, his early training, his last correspondence with his family, the sinking and loss of life of the Oklahoma, the devastating notification of loss, and the unparalleled joy of identification and return home.

What comfort we can take to know that our military continues on its mission to leave no serviceman behind...a gratifying conclusion after nearly 79 years for this American war hero. John Karli's name will be added to the list Memorial list of the fallen in Lacy Park.

I am grateful and honored to have blossomed as a leader under the sponsorship and mentorship of Lucille Norberg, groomed from member to dignified Rotarian. It should come as no surprise that she was awarded 2018 \*\*Congressional Women of the Year \*\* by Congresswoman Judy Chu. \*\*

Twenty-five years ago the CSULA Rotaractors along with the Alhambra Club buried a time capsule for opening in October 2019. Last Sunday, Rotaractors, Club advisors and District Governor Lu met at its site at the Metrolink campus station to dig it out.

Only one person could be located that was a part of the initial project, PDG and Alhambra Rotarian Chris Montan. But she could not remember any of the details except to say it was �a box�. A Rotaraian contractor agreed to extract the capsule (donating his time, crew and equipment).

It took the contractor and four of his workers about two hours to bust up the concrete base that held the brass plaque but, no box. Next, the hole where the concrete base had been had been was dug deeper and wider another hour of work. Some decided the box was not there, and left discouraged.

As the contractor was about to fill in the hole, Alhambra Rotarian Isabel Cruz said she would try, got into the hole, and began to widen the hole. Digging more to the
