??????Next week on October 24<sup>th</sup> come hear �Coach Pop" as he is known by most in the basketball community. He is entering his 10<sup>th</sup> year at the helm of San Marino basketball. In nine seasons, the Titan basketball program has earned *eight* consecutive CIF playoff berth appearance, multiple top three finishes in the very tough Rio Hondo league and in 2017 made the �CIF Elite 8� for the first time since 1978 losing to the eventual division 4AA champion West Torrance by two pts in overtime.

Previously, Mihail coached at St. Francis High School for nine years. During his nine year tenure, Coach Pop served as the freshman and JV head coach as well as assisted the varsity team each of those years. He helped change the culture and proved that through hard work and enthusiasm and a little bit of talent, a great deal of success could be accomplished. He led his freshman teams to the top of the Mission league where they won the league championship for the first time in over 10 years in 2005 and had many successful seasons earning records of 18-5, 19-4, 22-3, 14-10 in his last four seasons.

Several in the board expressed interest. No one expressed any opposition. The Charities committee will review it.
- 2. School Superintendent Wilson has requested 15 minutes to make a presentation to the Rotary Club in support of bonds for the school district. Greg will advise him that there needs to be some time made available for possible opposition.
- 3. P-Mail Restrictions. To keep this capability from being abused, Greg will send out an email explaining guidelines for members and committee members to follow. Basically, to send to all members you need to have executive committee approval. But committee members can send Rotary-related P-mail to other committee members. Governor Arredondo mentioned that in January the District will be sending out their own new guidelines for using DACdb mailing to members. She said it was good that our club is already moving in that direction.

## I. Bike Project Hung

- 1. Scheduled for Sat. Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> at Pasadena Unified School District maintenance yard. Several other clubs will be helping as well, from 8 am.
- 2. Isaac will make presentation about the spending side of the Foundation. We receive about \$6700/year from District funds for projects like Bike Project and Rotary Readers. Round 2 will provide additional \$1K of funding that we can consider using for the Corazon Project. District Governor Arredondo mentioned that there might be a Round Three this year.
- 3. March 12 is the Paul Harris Luncheon. An invitation was extended to the District Governor to attend.

# I. Charities Driebe

1. The committee approved its budget at the last meeting. Members want to have a significant amount of money to give away. This will be discussed at the next meeting.

#### I. District Governor Arredondo

- 1. Our district has \$15K from Rotary Int 1. to support programs benefiting early childhood (0-5 years). 3K has been requested. \$12K not yet requested and available for our club to request for San Marino or for other area and perhaps in partnership with another club.
- 2. John Jones said he needs \$4K to complete his Global Grant project and since it is U.S. based, it would qualify. The DG advised John to go into DACdb and submit a Round 3 grant request for Together We Read (TWR). Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> is the deadline to submit for those dollars, all of which must go toward 0-5 age projects. The younger the better.
- 3. Dennis advised the club that we are at 117 members. We have lost some recently due to death and moving away/retiring but we have also added some, so we are at 117. Dennis Maljanian will be away for 6 months to a year, so that will take us down to 116.
- 4. The DG reminded us that any member aged 18-to-30 receives half off on district dues. When we get the invoice from the district, we need to circle the names of the members that are age 30 or under and provide copy of driver so license to prove age.
- 5. James Nash will donate two tickets to the Rose Parade to be auctioned off.

The Next Board Meeting will take place on11-21-2019

The grant ideas should also be something that will last and is sustainable. The applications are due by November 12<sup>th</sup>.
