## The San Marino Rotary Rotoscope for September 12th, 2019 By Russ Osmonson.

**Program information for Sept 12<sup>th</sup>**- Local resident Tim Sloan brings to Rotary his many-year experiences in the banking industry, and specifically, with Wells Fargo Bank.

While Tim's spotless 31-year career earned him the promotion to CEO and President in October, 2016, he inherited quite a mess left behind by his predecessors. He took 'their heat' for this, with pickets even showing up at his home. Try as he may, years of bad-actors duping customers was not a quick turnaround. Tim resigned his posts in May 2019 and left the Board June 30.

Tim is a graduate of the University of Michigan, where he majored in Economics and Accounting. During his collegiate summers, he worked as a teller for Standard Federal Savings & Loan.

Tim was named an Honorary Paul Harris Fellow a few years back, when Greg Forgatch was also so honored. They were responsible for leading and providing the major funding effort at the high school for a state-of-the-art football field (turning it from sod to artificial turf), and track (removing the red clay and replacing with a cork-type surface). And, leaving enough money behind, for the field's replacement just a year or so ago.

So come meet good-guy and unassuming Tim, a long-term loyal banker and major donor...who made San Marino High sport venues better than he found them.

**Jim Lawson** (program speaker on Sept 5<sup>th</sup>) talked about the impact that he has as a docent at the Ronald Reagan Library. He referred to himself as a ♦ strange guy ♦ adding that he believes that he is a very perceptive person. He feels that his personality helps him as docent, especially when he engages young people in conversation. Jim enjoys interacting with people and says the docents on the floor at the Reagan Library are always available to answer questions, talk with people, and invest time to make a visit to the Library more rewarding. Jim says over 400,000 people visit the Library each year. States, citing the President Records Act of 1978.
