This week's speaker is an elected county supervisor from Riverside. He will give us an insider's view of California's COVID-19 policies to close businesses, including restaurants, in order to protect citizens from the pandemic. He will present a balanced perspective of the various points of view for re-opening California's businesses, considering both the harm caused by closing restaurants and other businesses and the risks of re-opening.

In 2018, Jeff Hewitt was elected as County Supervisor for the Fifth District of the Riverside County, representing over 2.4 million residents. The Fifth District includes 6 incorporated cities (*Moreno Valley, Calimesa, Beaumont, Banning, Perris, and Menifee*) and over 25 unincorporated communities. In this geographically diverse landscape, Supervisor Hewitt has the opportunity to alleviate many of the problems and concerns raised by residents in the Fifth District and throughout the entire county of Riverside.

Jeff Hewitt was born in Redlands, California and has spent most of his life in the Inland Empire. He graduated from Yucaipa High School and pursued his Bachelor of Science in Biology at the California State University, San Bernardino. While in college, Jeff started his own company by creating new applications for existing technology, then eventually applied what he learned to pool construction, including excavation, electrical, and plumbing. Since 1985 he has built his small business into the success that it is today.

Jeff has six children and has seven grandchildren raised in Riverside County and has been married for 30 years to his wife, Wendy. The Hewitt family enjoys a semi-rural lifestyle with numerous horses, pigs, dogs, and cats that add to their quality of life and reinforce their roots in the Inland Empire.

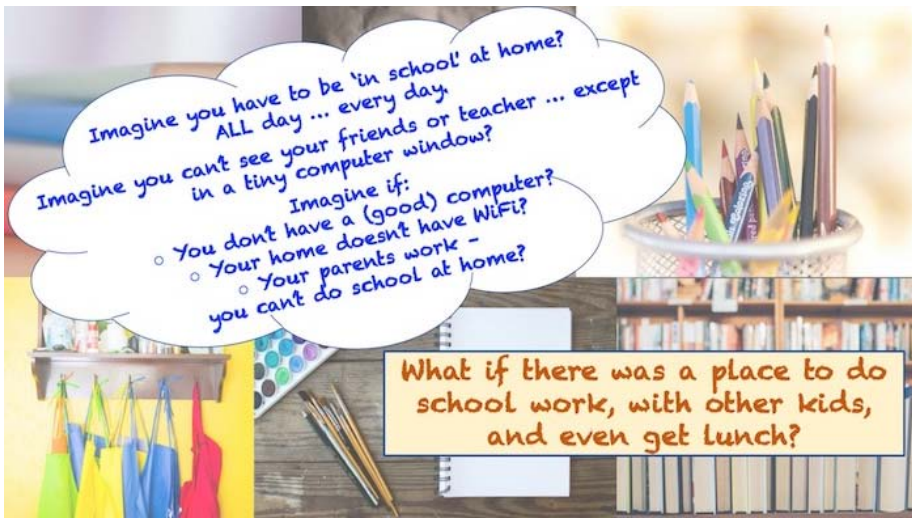
