Commander Hill is the Director of Operations for Naval Special Warfare Group THREE, headquartered at Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii.

A native of Long Beach, California, Commander Nicholas Hill enlisted in the Navy in 1998. He graduated from the United States Naval Academy where he was captain of the water polo team and was commissioned an Ensign in May 2003. He completed Basic Underwater Demolition/SEAL training with Class 248.

Commander Hill has planned and executed Special Operations in the AFRICOM, CENTCOM, and INDOPACOM Areas of Responsibility, His tours in the Navy include Assistant Platoon Commander at SEAL Team THREE, and Platoon Commander at SEAL Team SEVEN in San Diego, CA; Flag Aide to Commander, Naval Special Warfare Command in San Diego, California; a second tour as Platoon Commander at SEAL Team SEVEN, the Defense Language Institute in Washington D.C (where he studied the French language), and Operations Officer at Naval Special Warfare Unit TEN in Stuttgart, Germany. He also served as SEAL Delivery Vehicle Task Unit Commander and Executive Officer at SEAL Delivery Vehicle Team ONE in Pearl City, Hawaii. His most recent assignment was in Yokosuka, Japan where he served as Special Operations Advisor to Commander, U.S. SEVENTH Fleet.

Commander Hill holds a Bachelor of Science in Oceanography from the United States Naval Academy and a Master s Degree in International Policy from Stanford University. His decorations include the Silver Star Medal (two awards), the Bronze Star Medal with valor (two awards), the Bronze Star Medal, the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (two awards), the Joint Service Achievement Medal, the Combat Action Ribbon (two awards), and various unit and campaign awards.

Commander Hill lives Kailua, Hawaii with his wife Lisa, and two children Larsen (aged 5) and Carter (aged 4). AND, he is the son of Past President #76 Russ and Avalon Hill I

Congratulations... Mark Bixby Leadership Award

ROTARY SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION AWARDS BIXBY LEADERSHIP AWARD

It's hard to believe it has been almost ten years since the passing of Mark Bixby. For those of you who did not have the privilege to meet him, let me take a moment to share a few highlights of this remarkable human being.

Mark was "Long Beach." Yes, he is a member of the Bixby Family and the nephew of our own Jean Bixby Smith. Not only did he grow up in Long Beach, but he was the youngest Rotary Club of Long Beach President, and I had the honor of serving on his board. His adventurous spirit drove his desire to spearhead several community projects, such as the establishment of Rotary Centennial Park as well as the bicycle and pedestrian lane on the newly built replacement of the Gerald Desmond Bridge.

When his life was tragically cut short, the **Long Beach Rotary Scholarship Foundation** established the Mark Bixby Leadership Award to pay tribute to his dedication to improving and giving back to his community. This one-time \$3,000 award is presented annually to a current Rotary Scholarship recipient who demonstrates similar attributes that Mark embodied.

This year, I am honored to present the 2020 Mark Bixby Leadership Award to Taryn Williams. This year's selection was by far one of the most difficult tasks the committee and I took on. On paper, each of the applicants were worthy of the award. But after the interviews, the committee unanimously selected Taryn. She is not your typical scholarship recipient. Although she is a Long Beach native, Taryn overcame the challenges of a turbulent youth. A little older and a lot wiser, she attended LBCC and completed an associate degree in Business Administration and Economics. Taryn will graduate from CSULB this winter, double majoring in Business Administration and Management, Operations and Supply Chain Management. As I mentioned before, she is not our average college student. She is married and raising a set of twins. She will begin her Ph.D. in Management this spring to pursue her goal of working with, advocating for and re-integrating those who were formerly incarcerated back into the educational system while providing them with a wide range of support and safe spaces to connect and fortify their new journey.

Taryn is an amazing woman, whose past has empowered her to serve her community in an impactful way. She represents "Service Above Self" in a tangible way. And to say she embodies Mark is an understatement. As Brett Bixby, Mark's brother and fellow committee member, said, "Taryn's energy, self-motivation, clarity and drive align her with unique characteristics that Mark embodied. Her story is one of transcendence and is an example of how love, self-respect and a sturdy aim to help others can lift anyone toward a better path and an impactful life of service."
