Since 1996, former UCLA Quarterback, **Matt Stevens**, is currently the UCLA Radio Color Commentator. In addition, he is the Pre & Post Game Host for all UCLA Football games. In 1997, Stevens was nominated as the "Best Radio Color Commentary of the Year Award" voted by the Southern California Broadcasting Association. He has been a finalist nominee eight times. In 2019, Stevens was inducted into the Southern California Broadcaster Hall of Fame.

Since 2005, Stevens has been a Heisman Trophy voter. During that same year he was the Color Commentator for the Arena Football 2 team, the San Diego Riptide. In 2003, he was a NFL Sideline Reporter for Sports USA Radio Network. From 2000-06, Stevens was an analyst, field reporter and studio host covering UCLA Football on Fox Sports Net Television.

From 1982-86, Stevens was a Quarterback at UCLA and participated in three Rose Bowls, a Fiesta Bowl and a Freedom Bowl, all victories. In 1987, Stevens played in the Japan Bowl All-Star game. Stevens professional football career consisted of one-year stints with the Kansas City Chiefs, Los Angeles Cobras (Arena Football) and the Legnano Frogs (Milan, Italy). Consequently, he can say, "Set Hut" in Italian.

Currently, Stevens is the Managing Director for Greystone which provides Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac, FHA, Bridge and CMBS Multi-Family Loans nationwide and has funded over \$1 billion.

Stevens lives in El Cajon, CA (San Diego) with his wife, Andrea. They have a son, Matthew; two dogs, Andros and Chewie; three cats, Homie, Jayden and Zena; and six turtles.
