Jane Close Conoley serves as the seventh President of California State University, Long Beach. Prior to assuming this role she was the interim Chancellor of the University of California Riverside. She has also held leadership positions at the University of California Santa Barbara, Texas A&M University, and at the University of Nebraska Lincoln. Dr. Conoley is the author, co-author or editor of over one hundred thirty books, articles, and book chapters. Her latest book ◆ Positive Psychology and Family Therapy ◆ was co-authored with her husband, Dr. Collie W. Conoley.

She serves on numerous journal editorial and community service boards. She has received research, teaching and service honors during her career. Both the American Psychological Association and the Association of Psychological Science honored Dr. Conoley with Fellow status. Her research and development efforts in school safety, teacher quality, and student achievement have been supported by over \$50 million dollars in external federal, state, and private funds.

Her primary professional focus is to create pathways of success for California students seeking high education.

Service Above Self

Its Brief History

In 1910, at the First Rotary Convention in Chicago, Arthur Sheldon delivered a speech in which he said, ♦Only the science of right conduct toward others pays. Business is the science of human services. He profits most who serves his fellows best.

A derivative of the Rotary Motto was next heard in a speech at the Second Rotary Convention in 1911 in Portland, Oregon. On an outing with a member of the Seattle Club, Ben Collins, President of the Rotary Club of Minneapolis shared that the proper way to organize a Rotary Club was Service Not Self, the principle his Minneapolis Club adopted. Then, Rotary Counder Paul Harris asked Collins to share it at the Convention and it was well received. share it at the Convention and it was well received. At the same Convention, the Rotary Motto was then modified to He Profits Most Who Serves Best.

At the 1950 Rotary International Convention held in Detroit, Rotary formally adopted two official mottoes, *He Profits Most Who Serves Best*, and *Service Above Self*. In 1989, the Council on Legislation made *Service Above Self*, the Rotary Motto.



In 2004 and 2010, additional modifications took place and One Profits Most Who Services Best became Rotary �s Secondary Motto.
