Mark Eades is a retired journalist and former Disney Imagineer residing in Southern California.

Mark Eades started his 21-year Disney career while attending California State University, Fullerton. At Disney he spent seven years at Disneyland, three years at the Disney Studios and eleven years as an Imagineer at WED Enterprises – later renamed Walt Disney Imagineering. While at Walt Disney Imagineering he worked on EPCOT, and projects like "Star Tours:"
"MuppetVision 3D;" and Paris Disneyland.

After Disney, he worked on theme park projects for Universal and Warner Bros.

Mark switched to journalism in 1997, first at the Orange County Newschannel, then the Orange County Register. During his last eight years at the Register, Mark (in an ironic twist of fate) ended up covering Disneyland and theme parks.

Mark retired in 2017. He has served as the Treasurer of the non-profit charity Disneyland Alumni Club, since 2016 and is also editor of its weekly newsletter.

Mark has been married for 45 years, has five grown children and two grandchildren. He and his wife have lived in their Buena Park home for 40 years.

Dawn was recently elected as the City of Long Beach's 14th City Attorney – the first woman to be elected to that position! She will take the oath of office on December 20th, a fitting way for her to also celebrate her birthday that day.

I met Dawn in 2016 when she joined the City Attorney's Office - and in the old City Hall, our offices were on the same floor. You will find, as I did, that Dawn is a pleasure to get to know, engaging and warm with a very positive outlook. Later, I had the pleasure of facilitating the Leadership Long Beach Executive Leadership Series Class of 2020 which included Dawn. During the class projects and exercises, I found her to be a rare combination of being a team player AND a leader and enthusiastically so - she was always "all in."

Dawn grew up in Maryland where she developed a love of the ocean and environment. Her BS from University of Maryland and law degree from UC Davis put her on the path to work in environmental and governmental issues.

Before joining the City Attorney's office, she was senior counsel in a private sector firm representing municipalities, and she also worked for years in the General Counsel's office at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. She is licensed to practice in all state and federal courts in California as well as the U.S. Supreme Court. And now, with 30 years of experience as an attorney, Dawn is still dedicated to improving communities and the environment.

Dawn is an athlete, a former marathon runner who now roller blades several times a week. And as a competitive sailor, she races on a team of eight, usually in the bowman position. Being on the "pointy end" of the sailboat requires mental toughness, balance, agility, and courage. It's a position that must be ready for anything. There are many parallels between successful race boat crewing and her professional success. In the bow position, she is constantly ready to act and react, being aware of others on the team and on the race course -- not to mention the wind -- while being prepared for any possibility, then being ready to execute. Her team sometimes includes sailors who substitute for regular crew members so flexibility and adapting to other people, styles, and strengths is critical to success. Dawn's husband, Doug, is also a sailor and they are often on the same racing team.

Doug met Dawn when sailing in Marina Del Rey, and they've been married for 23 years. He is a software engineer at Boeing. He is also a pilot, and in his spare time, he is building a small airplane in the garage of their Long Beach home! Their two children are in college – Andrew at Orange Coast College and Katie at Trinity College in Dublin, Ireland.


