

Report from the Chair... Long Beach Rotary Charitable Foundation

Historically, the **Long Beach Rotary Charitable Foundation (LBRCF)** has been funded almost exclusively by Long Beach Rotarians' donations either as bequests, direct donations, or funds for birthdays or other recognitions.

As of September 30th, the Foundation had approximately \$1.345 million



The above figure provides a visual of the separation of funds in our accounts. The chart's large pink shaded areas represents the restricted funds, which is approximately 78%. Please note that the largest slice of the pie (over \$900,000) is a donation from former Rotarian Henry Meyer's estate. These funds when combined with the violet portion of almost \$120,000 donated by Bob Steuber and Family, are all restricted and fund our annual Camp Enterprise project. Thanks to the extremely generous donations of these two

outstanding Rotarians, Camp Enterprise will continue to be funded for many years into the future.

Other restricted funds are designated for Feeding the Future, Reading by 9, Centennial Park, and other Rotary projects.

The majority of the remaining \$300,000 is restricted by a formula that determines the amount available to be awarded each year. The formula takes the average value of the eligible account(s) at the end of each of the prior twelve quarters in a three-year period. From this amount 4% is eligible for spending by the LBRCF. For example, if the twelve-quarter average for the three-year period is \$200,000, then \$8000 is eligible to be spent in the current year.

Earlier this year I announced that the LBRCF Board was expanding by the addition of 2 members in each of the next 3 years with each serving a three-year term. These members are the first Board members who are not in the Club's presidential line nor appointed by Club's Presidents. We are excited to have Rich Gibson and John Romundstad as the first two to join the enlarged Board.

Discussions at recent Board meetings have been concerned with the LBRCF's focus. Where should we concentrate expenditure of our funds and resources? In the past, the LBRCF has utilized a grant process and awarded small grants to local non-profit organizations. Looking forward, the LBRCF Board of Directors would like the funds to support local, regional, and international projects and our Rotary Club's programs. Also, to look for opportunities to collaborate with other community projects which meet our mission.

It is the LBRCF Board's intention to expend funds consistent with the Club's mission. Our goals include increasing communication with the membership and community-at-large and providing more frequent updates to enhance our membership's understanding and support of the LBRCF.

Our Club's demographics have changed over the years, as well as the funding and donations toward the Club's projects and our Foundation. Because of this, we are exploring the possibility of creating an annual fundraising event that will not only raise funds for the LBRCF, but also engage our community and increasing their awareness of the Club.

Our objective is to be deliberative and create a long-term funding and distribution plan for your LBRCF. This year is the beginning of the process that will result in a robust organization which is instrumental to improving our community, elevating the presence of the Rotary Club of Long Beach, and providing opportunities for you, our members, to engage in projects and programs.

On February 1st, after a two-year hiatus, the Evening Focus Dinner (EFD) meeting discussions *(formerly Evening Panel Dinners)* will focus on the Long Beach Rotary Charitable Foundation. It is our hope that you will save that evening on your calendar and attend one of these meetings to provide your input.
