Why Give?

Many Long Beach Rotarians may ask ♦ why give to the Scholarship Foundation? Well, I asked Vic McCarty who has been a RCLB member since 1968, 52 years. He told me, ♦I give because it has to do with education, which if not the most important reason, it is one of the most. I like the concept of helping young people succeed in their education, which is vital for personal and economic success. ♦

Vic graduated from Wilson High School in 1945 and enrolled at Long Beach City College right afterward, waiting to be drafted. He says he enjoyed his one year there so he could play basketball and take some classes. (Vic fulfilled a personal commitment to 'never take a book off campus.') He was drafted and served in the US Army. After he was discharged, he returned to LBCC because he knew he had to get his grades up to transfer to UCSB and UCLA. He graduated UCLA as an accounting major and went on to earn his CPA license. He joined the RCLB in 1968 after being hired by Windes Accounting Firm, where he eventually rose to become Partner in Charge. He served as the RCLB President #68 in 1984-85 and wanted to set a good example by making a donation to the Scholarship Foundation which had been established in 1964. Vic's commitment is followed by every member of the LBR Scholarship Foundation Board of Directors as everyone contributes annually.

Vic and Patty have been married for 56 years and have 3 children and 1 grandchild. 100% of their annual LBRSF contribution goes directly to support our community youth, where one of our Traditional Wilson High School scholarship recipients is recognized as the **McCarty Scholar**.

Although endowed named scholarships start at \$100,000, annual named scholarships can be made with a contribution of \$1,250 for a LBCC student or \$2,500 for a CSULB student. Enjoy a visit to the LBR Scholarship Foundation website.
