Alfredo Velasco was born in Mexico City and immigrated with his family to the United States in the 1960 s. Growing up in Burbank, he spent time at and enjoyed programs of the local YMCA with the aid of financial assistance.

He attended UCLA on a football scholarship and was an All-American place kicker. Prior to graduating with a bachelor �s degree in History, he met his wife Laura, a fellow UCLA student and athlete. She was a Pac-10 middle distance runner --he claims she had been stalking him and she claims the opposite.

Alfredo was a participant and then coached for Kicking Camps held at CSULB by Ben Agajanian, ex-NFL kicker and coach. He was a guest color commentator for halftime and post game for the Los Angeles Raiders in Spanish for a season. He also was in a youth Mariachi band and was an advanced violin player!

Alfredo was the Regional Executive Director of the YMCA of San Diego, serving for 23 years. He has been the President & CEO of the YMCA of Greater Long Beach since 2013.

He serves on various state and national boards and serves locally on the boards of Bikes for Kids; the non-profit Pastor for the City, and others. He also serves as a Eucharistic Minister at St. Anne St Church. Alfredo has served as president of the Rotary Club of Escondido and currently is Treasurer of the RCLB Charitable Foundation. He is the RCLB president-nominee for 2022-2023.

Alfredo believes that people fall into one of three camps: the mountains, beach or desert. He is a mountain person � he loves hiking, backpacking, skiing, and mountain biking. He lives in Seal Beach with Laura and their three children, ages 20, 18, and 16.
