Rene has been an elementary school teacher for 27 years and taught Special Education part time for 20 years at Cerritos College. She is an advocate for the disabled, an author, and a passionate Dragon boat paddler and coach. Recently Rene took a leap of faith to start a new dragon boat team in Long Beach called Team Synergy. Team Synergy focuses on the inclusion of all! Some paddlers have physical disabilities, others are deaf or hard of hearing, others are blind and many teammates have no impairments but choose this team over others because of the people, the passion and the perseverance we exemplify! Synergy represents the interaction and inclusion of two or more groups in order to produce a result greater than the sum of its separate parts!

Rene would describe herself as a wife, mother, teacher and athlete. This might seem ordinary unless you know that Rene was born 10 weeks premature with Severe Spastic Cerebral Palsy. At birth doctors were unsure if Rene would ever walk, talk or be educated. She has far surpassed these expectations and will share her story of triumph with you today!


This fellowship group is limited to 24 people.
