SUBBARAO V. MYLA, MD, FACC, FSCAI, MMM, CPE DR. JOEL H. MANCHESTER ENDOWED CHAIR IN INTERVENTIONAL CARDIOLOGY

Subbarao Myla, MD, is medical director of Cardiac and Endovascular Labs and Cardiovascular Research at the Jeffrey M. Carlton Heart & Vascular Institute. Dr. Myla leads Hoag s renowned program that initiates dozens of groundbreaking clinical trials investigating innovative medical devices and procedures focusing on stroke prevention. Dr. Myla s approach emphasizes education for patients, physicians and staff. He showcases leading-edge techniques through workshops, live demonstrations and preceptorship that serve as invaluable instructional tools.

He has been named a fellow of the American College of Cardiology (FACC), a fellow of the Society of Cardiovascular Angiography & Intervention (FSCAI), a member of the International Society of Endovascular Specialists (ISES) and president of the non-profit Foundation for Endovascular Education and Research (FEVER).

He received his medical degree from Guntur Medical College at Nagarjuna University in India and went on to do his residency training at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver, Canada followed by residency training at several renowned New York hospitals. Dr. Myla then completed a cardiology and interventional cardiology fellowship at the State University of New York, Down State Coney Island Hospital, and Maimonides Medical Center in Brooklyn.
