So Much More Than a Fish Tank: Making a Difference

Peter Kareiva, CEO, President Aquarium of the Pacific

Peter Kareiva is the CEO, President of the Aquarium of Pacific and a Research Professor at UCLA, where he was previously the Director of the Institute of the Environment and Sustainability. He has taught at Brown University, University of Washington, UCSB, Stanford, Santa Clara University, University of Virginia, and Swedish Agricultural University in Uppsala.

In addition to numerous popular articles, Kareiva has published over 200 scientific papers and authored or edited eight books in fields ranging from conservation, genetic engineering, evolution, climate change, agriculture and risk analysis.

Dr. Kareiva has served as the Vice President of Science for The Nature Conservancy, and Director of the Division of Conservation Biology at Northwest Fisheries Science Center of NOAA. His honors include election to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and election to The National Academy of Sciences. His career is unique because of how frequently he has moved between academia, the private sector, and the federal government.

He is currently the Chief Scientist for <u>relistwolves.org</u> – a volunteer group of committed citizens that is disturbed by the thoughtless and unnecessary slaughter of wolves taking place in Montana, Wyoming, and Idaho. He is committed to science that engages the public and believes that connecting to nature is the one thing that can overcome the deep political and social divides that plague the nation today.


