Last Thursday, a dozen Long Beach Rotarians reengaged in what was a routine, pre-pandemic activity, reading to children at a local elementary school.

At Burbank CDC (Child Development Center), 3-4 year old youngsters received books and were read to in small groups. This morning activity was organized by our Club's Reading by Nine Committee and Cindy Young, Long Unified School District's Director for Child Development Centers and Kids' Club.

It was evident that not only did Rotarians miss their engagement in the Reading Program, but so did the children. As I was walking down the hallway with Dale Whitney before the program started, I said "Hello" to a student sitting at a desk and working on a laptop. As I passed the student, who was

perhaps in 4th or 5th grade, I saw a huge grin on her face. The reason for the happy expression was Dale.

Dale gave a warm and happy "Hello!" and then stayed to speak with the student. She was part of a pre-pandemic student group Dale read to on a regular basis. It was evident they were very happy to see each other.

Each Rotarian sat at a table with three or four students. These tables were built for four-year old children, not adults! On each table were several books and each child was asked to select a book that they would like to take home. Our Club provided a book plate, "I am a Rotary Reader! This book belongs to me!" and a place for the child's name. The looks on the children's faces were priceless when they were told that this was **their** book.



As I was reading to Maya, Katherine, and Layla and pointing out the different sea creatures in "See to Sea" (with googlyeyes!), counting octopus' legs, or worrying about what happened to Stick in "Stick and Stone," I was brought back to when my daughters were at that age. When reading with children, we point out funny pictures, ask them to find colors, highlight words and their meanings, count objects, answer questions, go back a page when they reach out and turn the page back. We are actively engaged with them as they learn to read.

This engagement clearly reinforces the importance of our Literacy Committee and Reading by Nine Program. Reading to our children is something we take for granted, but it is not part of the life for many children in our community. By offering books for children to take home, we are providing opportunities for other parents to read to their children, and as we know, as the children learn to read, they will read the books to their parents.

After reading to the students, Ms. Young shared with us the major changes in the coming year for LBUSD and schools statewide. Kindergarten classes will be going full day; with new classroom settings and instruction, schools will be bridging Early Childhood Education and Kindergarten; and after-school programs will be offered through the eighth grade. This new path for children improves primary education statewide and education experience through and beyond high school. Thankfully the state is providing the financial resources to LBUSD to create, staff, and facilities for

implementation of the new requirements. However, there is a tremendous strain on human resources to have the programs in place by the September deadline.

When the 2022-23 school year begins in August, look for announcements from the Literacy Committee for opportunities to read in our local classrooms, and sign up to spend some time in a small chair in a classroom reading about sea creatures, animated objects, challenges for boys and girls to solve, and other adventures that captivate and engage both the students and the readers.
