caryn desai has an interesting signature plate on her emails • her name is in all lower case letters. Designed by one of her artist friends for a poster for a show caryn was directing many years ago, she has been using it ever since.

Distinguished Rotarians Judy Ross and Freda Hinsche Otto sponsored caryn into the Rotary Club of Long Beach because of her commitment to serving the Long Beach Community as well as having a wealth of local experience and qualifications. Freda stated on caryn sees new member application, so I am a huge fan of caryn desai, who is an incredible business manager, a talented professional producer, a huge asset to the Long Beach community and a caring and generous individual. That says it all. As the Artistic Director/Producer for the International City Theatre (ICT), caryn has been working and serving in that role for 30+ years.

Growing up in Camden, New Jersey (it so cold there), caryn was the middle child out of six children (all girls!) She did not have a privileged upbringing, often not having proper clothing for cold winters and long walks to school. However, from these humble beginnings, a spirit of determination and resourcefulness was forged. Though the family could not afford art school, caryn found a way to attend by working for the art school at age 15, and she has not stopped working since. After high school, she moved away from home with her older sister, and later married and moved to California.

With two young children, caryn attended LBCC and CSULB -- and graduated from both with a 4.0 GPA! With an AA and BA in Acting and Directing, she entered the Masters of Fine Arts program at UCI (one of only two candidates accepted) where she changed her focus from acting to directing. With her MFA, caryn became the General Manager for the Long Beach Theatre Company which was started on the LBCC campus, and she taught at LBCC for more than 25 years.

At ICT, caryn so career has been exceptional. Her productions have been nominated for and won many awards. She is a member of the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society and has a certificate from the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art, London, among many other fellowships and certificates. Highly recognized by notable organizations including the L.A. Drama Critics Circle and the African American History and Culture Foundation, caryn has also been recognized locally by the Rosie the Riveter Foundation and has received Distinguished Alumna awards from both LBCC and CSULB, as well as being named Senterprising Woman of the Year.

On the personal side, caryn resides with her husband, Sashin, who is an avid photographer. She loves to travel, cook healthy food and rarely misses her workouts (yoga, pilates, barre, etc). One thing that makes caryn happy is seeing her friends and family in good health. She also loves to see an audience when they are moved or touched by a performance. She sees theater as an important art form that helps us to see and understand our shared humanity through the art of storytelling.

Lisa asked us to share the good news that the first round of chemo was very effective at eliminating the leukemia cells. She will return to City of Hope for another round of intensive chemo May 10-15 to eradicate any remaining pre-leukemia cells. After additional treatments at home, she will be tested again \diamond and if results are clear, she could begin the bone marrow transplant procedure as early as July.

- 1.) MOST IMPORTANT -Lisa will need a bone marrow donor. She has a rare blood type, A negative, and there is no match in the current international data base! Please help find a match for Lisa. If you aren t in the ideal donor category (18-44 years old), please spread the word with friends and neighbors with A negative blood type to get tested. You � or someone you know � could be the ONE!
