StoveTeam International's Executive Director, Shelby Kardas, is grateful for the opportunity to share StoveTeam's mission and history. With a background in international business development, fundraising, and non-profit leadership, Shelby is passionate about combating the leading environmental cause of death and disability in the world and bringing improved health and opportunity to families in Latin America.

StoveTeam International was founded by Rotarian, Nancy Hughes, with crucial assistance from her local Rotary club in Eugene, Oregon, and Rotary International. StoveTeam's mission is to facilitate the placement of low-smoke, fuel-efficient, and safe cookstoves to support families and protect the environment. Stove Team's innovative model for assisting entrepreneurs in Latin America has been awarded the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Partnership for Clean Indoor Air Award for Developing Local Markets for creating local employment while improving health and reducing air pollution. To date, local factories started by StoveTeam have produced more than 78,000 stoves, improving the lives of more than half a million people and preventing nearly one million tons of CO2 from entering the atmosphere.
