This week we are announcing and proudly welcoming Dr. Baker to the Rotary Club of Long Beach, and there are very few residents who come with the pedigree and passion for the development of our youth as she has.

For over 28 years, Jill has served the Long Beach Unified School District (LBUSD) community, and as of last August has served as its Superintendent. Spending her first five years in education as an elementary school teacher provided her the foundation for a profoundly impactful career in administration. Specifically, Dr. Baker has been integral in LBUSD s work to better support underrepresented communities and build systems and processes to close the achievement gap and meet kid s and family s needs. The work she has been involved in built one of the premiere school districts in the country having been recognized both at the state and Washington, D.C. level.

These accomplishments are great, but Dr. Baker could not be humbler. In a conversation with Dr. Baker, anyone will be able to quickly tell that she simply cares for the work she does and for the development of the over 10,000 employees under her leadership.

Beyond her professional background, in Dr. Baker Rotary is also gaining a determined community servant and volunteer. A large part of her work has been focused on supporting women who ever overcome similar challenges that she has, like being a breast cancer survivor. Speaking with women facing this challenge, and survivors and fighters, is a passion of Dr. Baker s and she proudly serves on the MemorialCare Todd Cancer Institute board at Long Beach Medical Center to continue to advance this work.

In addition to this extremely important and personal mission, Dr. Baker also spends her extra time serving on the Board of Directors for the Long Beach Financial Credit Union which was created in 1935 to serve Long Beach school district and city college employees. This historic institution in Long Beach has since expanded to serve a wide-range of communities and serves as an example for how local, community-focused banks can be the future of U.S. banking.

There is no question that work and service are passions of Jilles, but family comes first for her and are what grounds this amazing new member. Nearly 29 years ago, actually the same week she started her first day with LBUSD, she married her partner and Millikan High School graduate, Trevor. Together they raised a son, also a Millikan Ram, who is now 21 and about to graduate from Biola University with a degree in psychology. Through her son, Jill and her family las legacy of helping people succeed will continue. Funny enough, Jill s mother was also a long-time educator, teaching the first grade for many years \diamond serving as one of Dr. Baker \diamond s key inspirations for her life \diamond s mission.

Mobile DACdb Tutorial - Repeat Article by Request!

On your phone use your web browser (my web browser is Safari) and enter www.m.dacdb.com That should take you to a log in screen. Your Login name is your last name and first initial---beckm. Your Password is lb (for Long Beach) and your first name &lbmollie (and for your internet safety folks. ♦ 1. ♦ ve changed mine so ha!). You do not need Club # but, if you wish, it's 840. Press ♦ Rem. Me♦ so you don♦t have to log in every time. Press **&Login**.

Now .at the bottom of your screen very bottom outside of the web site, is a box with an arrow pointing up. Press the box and it will open sending options such as Message Mail Reminders Below those are some black and white icons, mine say Add to Reading List ♦Add Bookmark♦ etc. Scroll to the right to ♦Add to Home Screen♦. Press that button and this web site will now save itself just like an app on your phone so you can access it anytime.

I find I use ϕ My Club ϕ the most and under that ϕ Members ϕ . They are in alpha order but you can search using just a first name if that ϕ s all you know. You lifting their picture and all their contact information even the option to text so the program sends you directly to your messaging app and you don t have to fuss with copy and paste.

If you want to use DACdb on your desktop, I find it so much easier to sort and do other functions there. www.DACdb.com use the same login information. It's always a good idea to check your own entry occasionally to ensure your business and personal information is current - if not, please let the Rotary office know.
