John Morris is a trailblazing entrepreneur with a rich history of contributing to the vibrant City of Long Beach. In 1979, he made his mark on the hospitality industry by opening Legends, the world's first-ever sports bar. This groundbreaking venture showcased his foresight and set the stage for his remarkable career.

Continuing his entrepreneurial pursuits, John took on various leadership roles that helped shape the landscape of Long Beach. He served as the President of the Belmont Shore Business Association during the 1980s, where he played a pivotal role in the business community and was the founder of the Belmont Shore Christmas Parade.

John's visionary leadership then led him to become the President of the Downtown Long Beach Associates, where he revitalized Pine Avenue and transformed the downtown area into a bustling hub of commerce and culture.

In recent years, John's dedication to community-building extended to organizing the Big Bang on the Bay, an annual firework event that celebrates Independence Day. Despite facing legal challenges from an environmental agency over the Clean Water Act, John successfully defended the event in court, ensuring its continuity and allowing it to thrive.

Under his guidance, the 2023 edition of Big Bang on the Bay became the most successful one to date, raising over \$125,000 to support local charities. This accomplishment exemplifies John's commitment to giving back to the community and making a positive impact on the lives of others.

Today, as the owner of Boathouse on the Bay, John continues to create memorable experiences and contribute to the flourishing spirit of Long Beach. His leadership and entrepreneurial spirit remains at the forefront as he drives innovation and fosters a sense of community through his endeavors.
