103 years ago, seven Long Beach businessmen met with **Granville Savage**, a Rotarian visiting from New York. He is considered the ♦Father of LB Rotary♦. He told them that a Rotary Club was needed in Long Beach, and what it would mean toward cementing the friendships and fellowships of our fellow men, and also how it would serve to elevate the business ethics of all of us.

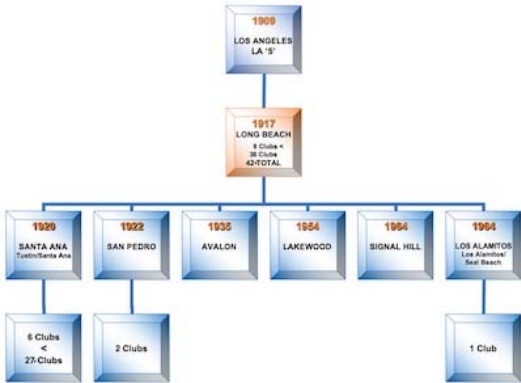

They could not have imagined that the club they chartered on November 1st, 1917, would become a service club that would parallel Long Beach's history and that its members would, for over a century, contribute time, talent, and treasure to benefit this City.

Those first charter members caught the vision of creating an organization that would cement friendships, contribute to community, and elevate business ethics.



LA 5 (the 5th RI Club chartered in 1909) sponsored Long Beach. From 1920-1964, **Long Beach sponsored 6 Clubs: Santa Ana, San Pedro, Avalon, Lakewood, Signal Hill and Los Alamitos** (now Los Alamitos/SealBeach).

From the start of our Club, over 42 additional clubs have been started, thanks to Granville Savage, 15 Charter Members and LA's vision.

Santa Ana, now Tustin-Santa Ana, which we sponsored in May, 1920, recently had to postpone their 100th anniversary recognition until 2021. We look forward to celebrating with them next year!

Today, Long Beach is among the top 50 around the world and comprised of almost 300 members whose motto is, **Service Above Self**.

Rotary Founder, Paul Harris, visited Long Beach twice ... once in 1925 (left photo) and again in 1941 when he planted a magnolia tree in Bixby Park, just before our 25th Anniversary.
