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

Robert A. Nagourney, MD

Medical and Laboratory Director The Nagourney Cancer Institute

Robert A. Nagourney, MD, is Medical and Laboratory Director of The Nagourney Cancer Institute in Long Beach, CA and an Associate Clinical Professor, at University of California Irvine. He is board certified in Internal Medicine, Medical Oncology, Hematology and the author of a book "Outliving Cancer."

A native of Bridgeport, CT., Dr. Nagourney completed undergraduate education at Boston University, earning a BA in Chemistry, Summa Cum Laude, and Phi Beta Kappa with Distinction in Biochemistry. He received his MD at McGill University in Montreal, Canada, where he was a University Scholar. After completing his residency in Internal Medicine at the UC Irvine, Dr. Nagourney received fellowship training in Medical Oncology at Georgetown University in Washington, DC and went on to complete a second fellowship in Hematology at the Scripps Institute in La Jolla where he was the recipient of the Scripps Institute Young Investigator Award.

After serving as the Medical Director of the Todd Cancer Institute, Dr. Nagourney later went on to create The Nagourney Cancer Institute, a cancer research center located in Long Beach, that has pioneered the development of "functional profiling" in human tumors. This platform uses human tumor biopsies in tissue culture to measure the effect of chemotherapy drugs and combinations to select treatments for cancer patients. His research was the topic of Dr. Nagourney's highly acclaimed TEDx talk.

With over 20 years experience in human tumor primary culture analyses, Dr. Nagourney has authored more than 100 published manuscripts, book chapters and abstracts. In 2015, he was the recipient of the NAACP "Trailblazer In Medicine" Award. Dr. Nagourney is a frequently invited lecturer for numerous professional organizations and universities.
