Please plan on joining us at the Rotary meeting on **OCTOBER 12th** as we raise funds for the 24th year for our **READING BY 9** Program. New Rotarians, this is always a fun and inspiring meeting as in a few minutes you will see the generosity of our members as hands go in the air and many thousands of dollars are raised to support our goal of having kids read at grade level by age 9. We are thrilled to again be "live" at The Grand as we build to our 5,000th Rotary meeting celebration two weeks later.

Last year we raised a record \$86,500 and over 120 Rotarians and guests contributed to our success. As a result of your generosity over the years we have now raised in excess of \$880,000 and donated more than 310,000 books and ebooks to Long Beach kids, classrooms, libraries and literacy programs. Our Rotary Literacy Committee is hard at work to maximize our fundraising results and to identify programs that address the early education and literacy needs in our community. Our theme this year is "March to a Million" as we are working hard to maximize matching donations, increase Rotarian participation to as close to 100% as possible and try to reach \$1 Million in funds raised by our Club's 5,000th meeting. We

realize these are lofty goals, but as we emerge from a pandemic that has adversely affected reading progress, providing books to kids (especially lower income and at-risk kids) and supporting early literacy endeavors is more important than ever.

Please mark your calendar and join us on **October 12th** at Rotary to be part of our 24th year of fundraising as we seek to increase last year's record and March to a Million! As the date approaches and at the meeting we will provide you with more information on the programs we will be supporting this year, matching grants, fundraising levels and how to donate if you are unable to attend on October 12th. You can be assured that your donations will continue to support our pre-school book program with the Child Development Centers, innovative Teacher and Nonprofit Literacy Grants, and other programs that are priorities with the LBUSD and those that focus on putting books in the hands of kids in underserved areas.

Thanks to all of you for your past support. We hope you will again consider a generous donation that will benefit our local pre-school kids, achieve our fundraising goals and help celebrate our Club's 5,000th meeting and long history.

Did You Know... How We Elect RCLB Presidents?



VOTE FOR 7 MEMBERS OF THE 2022 ELECTION COMMITTEE

This Election Committee will select the 109th President of the Rotary Club of Long Beach 2025-2026

Please participate - your vote counts

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- 1. This week you will receive Ballot #1 via email and postal service.
- 2. Please cast your vote for ONLY 7 representatives who will select the future leadership of the RCLB.
- 3. Email your selection of 7 names to the Rotary office OR print your ballot, mark the 7 names, and mail to the Rotary office (400 Oceangate, Suite 470, Long Beach, CA 90802). Either way, ballots must be received by 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, September 28.

The fine print per the Bylaws:

- The candidates on the ballot are Active members in good standing for 3+ years as of November 1, 2022.
- Previous year's Election Committee members are not eligible.
- Honorary members are ineligible to vote or to serve on the Election Committee.
- Any ballots received after the deadline will be disqualified.
- Ballots with more than 7 votes, fewer than 7 votes or more than 1 vote cast per candidate will be disqualified.

WHAT COMES NEXT:

Following the tally of Ballot #1, you will receive Ballot #2 via email with the 14 names with the highest votes. You will again vote for

ONLY 7, and follow the instructions that will accompany Ballot #2.

THE ELECTION COMMITTEE

Ballots will be counted by three members of the outgoing Election Committee.

The Election Committee serves for one year, Nov. 1 - Oct. 31. The most senior Past President, determined by year of presidency, shall serve as Chair. Should no Past President be elected to the Committee, the longest serving member of Rotary shall serve as Chair. The Chair may relinquish leadership to the next most qualified member. No person shall serve as Election Committee Chair more than twice in a six-year period.

Should any of the 7 elected members desire their name be included in the nominating process for President-designate, they will relinquish their position on the Committee. Any vacated position will then be filled with the Rotarian receiving the next highest votes from the membership.

The newly composed Election Committee (7 Rotarians), plus the President, Immediate Past President, President-elect, President-nominee and Club Administrator will meet to discuss eligible President-designate candidates and related matters. Members of the Election Committee shall not be eligible to be elected as President-designate.

The Election Committee not only selects the President-designate but also approves the proposed directors and officers of the Club for the succeeding fiscal year. Notice of the results of the election of officers and directors by the Election Committee shall not be given to the members until the RCLB annual meeting, customarily the 2nd Wednesday in December, when the President-elect announces the future Board of Directors, concluding with the announcement of the President-designate.
